ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1514-1515) teaches that this sacrament is not only for those at the point of death, but for anyone seriously ill or facing serious surgery. In fact, it is preferred that parishioners entering the hospital for surgery should ask the priest for this sacrament before being admitted. Parishioners should never wait until the last minute to call. We encourage parishioners facing surgery to let the parish priest know of their condition before entering the hospital so that they can be anointed before admission.





EXPLORING THE WORD

For a humble guy, St. Paul really tells it like it is. It seems some of the Corinthians did not believe that Christ rose from the dead, or that resurrection was a spiritual symbol of forgiveness of sins. So Paul lists those witnesses who actually saw the risen Jesus, last and least of these being Paul himself. Now we are used to thinking of Paul as one of the greatest apostles, even though we know he once persecuted Christians. So you might think he is being overly humble, like someone fishing for a compliment. No, Paul is only interested in making sure the Corinthians understand just how much God has done.

Besides being "born abnormally" (1 Corinthians 15:8), that is, coming to follow Christ in such an unusual way, he felt unworthy because of so many Christians he hurt before his conversion. Yet he turns that unworthiness into an example of how much God has done through him, so he can say that he worked harder than any other apostles because of God's grace, not Paul's strength. The same grace that turned a former enemy into a friend also gave him the strength to spread the gospel farther than anyone else at that time.

In today's Gospel, Peter has a similar experience. He was a fisherman who knew his business and knew that some days, the fish just aren't there. So when Jesus tells him to go out one more time, try one more cast of the nets, Peter probably thought he'd show Jesus that it was no use. Then when they caught enough fish to fill both boats, he realized that his pride was sinful. He was unworthy to receive such bounty from the Lord. And yet Jesus tells him that "you will be catching men" (Luke 5:10).

How many of us are like Peter and Paul, thinking we know just what our place in the world is, relying on our own strengths to do our jobs? Surely that's all God expects of us, right? They found Jesus calling them to a much more challenging life. Do we have the courage to listen to God's call to serve?

<u>Alb</u>

The alb is the fundamental vestment for any liturgical minister. It covers the body from neck to ankle like a light, close-fitting robe with sleeves. It is white. The vestment takes its name from the Latin word for this color.

When a priest or deacon vests for Mass, he wears an alb beneath his stole and chasuble or dalmatic. If the alb does not conceal his other clothing at the neck, he wears an amice beneath the alb. If the alb is too long, he ties a cincture around it, binding the vestment at his waist.

In the United States, any acolyte, reader, altar server, or other minister at Mass may wear an alb (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 339*). If necessary, they would appropriately wear an amice or cincture as well, to cover other clothing or to help the fit of the garment. However, such ministers need not wear an alb; they may wear any dignified clothing.

The white color of the alb calls to mind the baptismal garment, which in turn recalls the color of garments worn by heavenly beings in the New Testament. For example, Jesus appears in white at the transfiguration (Mark 9:3); an angel wears white at the resurrection (Matthew 28:3); two people in white stand near the apostles at the Ascension (Acts 1:10); and in the Book of Revelation, white is worn by beings including those who are proven victorious in life (3:4-5), the 24 elders (4:4), martyrs (6:11), and a huge number standing before the Lamb (7:9,13-14).

Those who wear the alb at the altar on earth number themselves among the blessed who minister at the altar in heaven.

What color is an alb?

Shepherd's Corner

I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me

Ever since I can remember, whenever I heard today's gospel, the first thing I would think of is the common sense Jesus exhibited. Today, we hear how he gets into a boat to teach the crowds, and the first thing the writers tell us is that he sat down. Wouldn't that seem to be using common sense? I mean, I didn't live close to a lake or seashore, yet as a child, I was taught that one should not stand up in a small boat for fear of it capsizing.

So, why would the writers include that piece of information in the Gospel? Actually, there are two reasons we are told that he sits in the boat and preaches. One is practical; the other is theological. The practical reason has to do with the crowds pressing in on him. By getting in the boat and pulling a little offshore, more people would be able to see and hear him teach. With him a bit offshore, the crowd wouldn't be able to push in on him, trying to get his attention. They would have to quiet themselves down to listen to what he was saying.

The theological reason this description is included by Saint Luke is that sitting down to teach is the posture a rabbi would use. Saint Luke is telling his readers that Jesus wasn't just a son of a carpenter or a charismatic person, but he had the same authority to teach and preach as other rabbis and teachers of that time.

Did you know that we still use this imagery of sitting to teach in our Catholic Church? Have you ever noticed the Pope will remain seated for his homilies and proclamations? Contrary to what you may think, it's not an indictment of age, but a custom that still remains from our Jewish heritage.

And it's not simply the Pope who has that privilege to sit and teach. As you know, every diocese has a cathedral. The term 'cathedral' comes from the Latin word 'cathedra,' meaning seat or chair of the bishop. If you've been to Saint Patrick Cathedral in Fort Worth, you've seen the chair of the bishop on the left side of the altar. In the early centuries of the Church, a bishop would preach to the people from this chair. But as our Catholic Church grew in numbers, this practice faded away due to poor acoustics in old buildings. However, we still can glimpse this practice at an ordination, where the bishop will remain seated on the 'cathedra' during the Rite itself.

I was wondering if we (and I include myself in this)... Are we as fervent as those people who pressed in on him, wanting to hear everything He was saying? Do we make time during our week to open the Scriptures or to stop by Adoration and listen to Him speaking to us? When we come to Mass and the readings are proclaimed do we give Him our full attention?

May we continue to grow into a deeper relationship with Him each and every day.
