## ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1514-1515) teaches that this sacrament is not only for those at the point of death, but for anyone seriously ill or facing serious surgery. In fact, it is preferred that parishioners entering the hospital for surgery should ask the priest for this sacrament before being admitted. Parishioners should never wait until the last minute to call. We encourage parishioners facing surgery to let the parish priest know of their condition before entering the hospital so that they can be anointed before admission.



# Fully alivery Day

## **Ashes**

"You've got dirt on your forehead."

We're likely to hear those words from thoughtful friends who display their intimate concern as well as their religious absentmindedness when we go out in public after Mass on Ash Wednesday.

The Distribution of Ashes after the homily replaces the Penitential Act at the beginning of Mass. Instead of merely "calling to mind our sins," we receive a very public reminder of our sinfulness.

We hear: "Repent and believe in the Gospel," or, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

But it wasn't always that way. In the early Church, only public sinners wore ashes. These sinners convened regularly to prepare for their reconciliation at a parish service and they formed-well, what we now call "support groups." As penitents, they used to wear ashes on their heads or in their clothes. Symbols of human mortality, ashes represented their complete dependence on the mercy of God. In the Middle Ages, the support groups dwindled, but sinners remained strong in numbers. So Pope Urban II ordered up the first Ash Wednesday in 1091. Ashes were for everybody, and we've been rubbing dirt on our foreheads ever since.

Dirt is something we're constantly washing off children and ourselves. Only in church do we deliberately put dirt on the most public part of our bodies, our foreheads.

Ashes are what's left in the now-cold fireplace. Ashes heat the barbecue. Ashes are all that remains of the home after the tragic fire. Ashes enrich the compost heap. Ashes of the faithful departed fill commemorative urns. Ashes represent destruction, refuse, and waste, but they hint at new life.

Long before recycling became popular, the church got into the act on Ash Wednesday. Ever wonder what happens to those Palm Branches left over from last Holy Week? They've been burned into ash, stuffed into bags and now await the chance to dirty your forehead on Ash Wednesday this year. The symbol of Christ's glory has become the symbol of our sin.

On Ash Wednesday, you're not just another dirty face. No, you've tossed yourself into the recycling bin of Lent, ready for renewal this Easter.

# Shepherd's Corner

## I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me

So, what are you doing for Lent? Notice, I didn't ask what you were giving up. Yes, Lent is a time of sacrifice and penance, and most of us are used to just "giving up" something. But this season is so much more than that. This Lent, I invite you to prepare a little differently by asking yourself, "What good works are you doing?"

We are given the season of Lent to transform ourselves more into the image of Christ. So, now is the time to decide how we're going to live this season. I know there have been times in my life when Lent was almost over and the good intentions I had came to naught. I know I'm not the only one who has been in that situation. People have shared with me that, by the time they decided what they wanted to do for Lent, it was Easter. While they had good intentions, we know there is a saying that "the road to hell is paved with good intentions." Not a happy thought.

Sometimes it's hard to decide what to do or "give up" for Lent; it seems like the same thing over and over again, almost like a New Year's resolution. I remember giving up things like candy or sweets, and as I grew older, I tried to give up television...that didn't last long. Evidently, I don't have the best will power. I began to ask myself how giving up candy, sweets or TV really changed me. Sure, perhaps I lost a few pounds, but Lent is to be a spiritual journey.

At times, I also tried to give up things like gossip and uncharitable talk. Every night, I'd have to do an examination of my day to see how I did. What an eye opener that was for me! I didn't necessarily succeed in "giving it up," but what it did was make me see how much I participated in this kind of behavior; this realization allowed me to slowly change. As we know, the sacrifices we make are made to bring us to a deeper level of holiness; they're not simply something we do for 40 days and then go back to the way we were.

I do remember one year, about half way through Lent, a co-worker asked me what I gave up for Lent. I didn't know how to respond, as I really didn't give up any specific thing. I told him, instead of giving something up, I spent 15 minutes each evening reading the Bible. He responded, "Then you did give up something - you gave up your time." I never looked at it that way; all I wanted to do was something that would actually make a positive spiritual difference in my life.

Two years ago, I heard someone on Catholic radio say that they made sure they turned off the faucet when brushing their teeth and shaving. As they were saving water, they prayed for the people in various countries who didn't have clean drinking water.

Perhaps, look at the corporal works of mercy and attend to one of them a little more diligently. Can you be better at: feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty (see the above paragraph) clothing the naked (how much in our closets do we really need), giving shelter to the homeless, visiting the sick, praying for the imprisoned or helping those who are grieving?

I pray that this Lent will be a time of spiritual growth for you and your family, as well as our Church and our world. It may sound odd, but I wish you all a 'Happy' Lenten Season as you come into a deeper revelation of God's love and mercy for you.

#### **REMEMBER:**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is allowed to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.



I am excited to be part of the relaunching of the ChristCare program here at Good Shepherd Catholic Community. My husband and I, with our 2 grandsons, have been members of the parish for 4 years. I volunteer with Middle Ministries and Vacation Bible School, as well as participating in the Women Walking With Purpose Bible study. I have worked almost 20 years with financial assistance to low income families, first as a volunteer, then 13 years as a staff member at St. John the Apostle Parish. It is a privilege to bring the experiences I have, to provide relief to struggling families with the ChristCare program. But even more importantly to be witnesses to finding Christ in volunteers and clients as we all continue our faith journey.





Good Shepherd is currently revamping our ChristCare ministry, which provides short term financial assistance to people in need in our parish and the immediate surrounding area. This is an exciting and challenging process which we plan to complete by early April.

To put the parish in a position to achieve the intended goals of the ChristCare program, we are modifying the structure of the program to allow the parish to:

- manage and distribute ChristCare funding internally
- take calls from, and meet with, people in need of short-term financial assistance, counseling, etc
- invite them into a discussion of their faith

At the same time, we'll continue our partnership with CCFW, identifying candidates for their long-term case management programs, and make the appropriate referrals.



## CHILDCARE UPDATE:

Good Shepherd is in the process of hiring a new childcare coordinator. In order to allow us to offer childcare during weekend Masses and many other parish events, we are in need of workers to staff our childcare ministry.

This is a paid opportunity of \$15 per hour for those who are at least 18 years of age.

Volunteer opportunities are also available for teens, ages 14–17.






