ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1514-1515) teaches that this sacrament is not only for those at the point of death, but for anyone seriously ill or facing serious surgery. In fact, it is preferred that parishioners entering the hospital for surgery should ask the priest for this sacrament before being admitted. Parishioners should never wait until the last minute to call. We encourage parishioners facing surgery to let the parish priest know of their condition before entering the hospital so that they can be anointed before admission.

MASS INTENTIONS

Fully alivery Day

Good Friday

The Church solemnly observes Good Friday with a special liturgy called the Celebration of the Lord's Passion. It should take place at 3 PM, but another time may be chosen. It is not a Mass, but the priest and deacon vest as if it were. The altar should be bare- no Cross, candles, or cloth should adorn it. Musical instruments should be used sparingly, only to accompany singing. No bells are rung. The service begins as ministers enter the sanctuary and lie prostrate, face to the floor. Or they may kneel. The highlight of the Liturgy of the Word is the proclamation of the Passion according to St. John. One or three persons may read or sing it; the assembly may take part. All kneel for a time of silence when the narrative tells of the death of Jesus.

The liturgy continues with solemn prayers for the Church and the world. Then a Cross is unveiled or carried in procession. All may adore the Cross however they wish. The priest may remove his chasuble and his shoes. Music during this time may include the *Stabat Mater*. Bread consecrated at the Mass of the Lord's Supper is then brought to the altar, and all may share Communion. Whatever remains goes to a tabernacle, preferably outside the church.

As the service ends, the Cross is placed on the altar between two or four candles. When leaving the church, people should genuflect to the Cross.

Throughout the day, the faithful should observe the laws of fast and abstinence. They may confess their sins or receive the Anointing of the Sick, but no other sacraments may be celebrated. Only the sick may receive Communion apart from the Celebration of the Lord's Passion.

Shepherd's Corner

I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me

Did you ever really look at some of the television programs that exist today? I'm astounded by the number that consider themselves "Reality" TV. While I do like *The Great British Baking Show*, how many franchises are there of *The Real Housewives*? Many of these "reality" shows promote lifestyles filled with jealousy, fighting and debauchery. Why watch those? You can find the same thing if you read your Bible! For example, today's gospel of the Prodigal Son includes loose living, grudges, jealousy - it's all there.

Before we look at the main characters in this gospel, let's remind ourselves that the word 'prodigal' means lavish or wastefully extravagant. Theologians say this parable could be called the Prodigal Father, as the father gives his love and forgiveness in a lavish and seemingly wasteful way to his errant son. He is ready to accept his son back even after the heartache he caused.

That rebel son is the bad boy of the family. While we judge him on how he seems to have lived his life, we often forget to consider his relationship with his family. This 'bad' son asked his father for his share of the inheritance. That question should say something about his relationship with his father. It took a lot of nerve to say to his father, "give me the money now, since I will get it when you die anyway." That is not only insulting to his father, but had to be hurtful as well. Then, as the story goes on, we hear how he goes through this inheritance. As my father would say, his "money is burning a hole in his pocket" (which I just found out was a Dean Martin song).

But let's not simply consider the other son as the "good son." Sure, he says he works hard to please his father. He also says that he never disobeyed his father. But he seems to be holding on to a resentment against his father for not giving him the pat on the back he thinks he deserved. And I feel he is somewhat resentful or jealous of his brother. He won't even come in the house to celebrate that his brother returned. This almost sounds like a TV show we could market and call *The Real Brothers of Galilee*.

But what about the way we react to some situations in our life? Lent asks us to reflect and take that deeper look at ourselves. What is it that we need to repent of? We may not run off to another country and squander our inheritance, but how many times have we run off emotionally by immersing ourselves in work as we try to avoid some relationships or duties? Perhaps we spend hours on the computer or shopping. Isn't this like the "bad" son, casting aside gifts of money, time or friendships given to us?

Maybe we think we're like the "good son." We follow all the rules God or the Church has given us. But we need to ask ourselves about the attitude in which we follow those laws. If we simply keep the laws because it's the things we need to do to get into heaven, we miss the point (spirit) of the law that reminds us that the rules are for the betterment of ourselves and our brothers and sisters. Keeping the rules is good, but simply keeping the law for the law's sake can lead to an attitude of pointing fingers at those who don't live the way we think they should be living.

Every time I read this gospel, I have to remember the hurtful words of this "good" son. He talks of his brother's faults freely and without real knowledge of them. Remember, his brother went off to another country. How did he know his brother squandered his money on prostitutes? There was no social media showing the day-by-day details of his life. As far as we know, these were unfounded rumors and allegations spoken in anger. He damages his brother's reputation by the words he uses. Does our use of social media, email or gossip do the same? Does it create walls of division between us and others?

Then, when he is asked to join in the celebration, his jealousy tries to dissuade his father from giving his brother love and forgiveness. Instead, he reminds the father all his brother's faults. What do we do when we are to offer forgiveness? Do we remember, hold on, and point to the hurts of the past?

It doesn't matter what brother we see ourselves as. What we need to recognize is that the father reached out to both, just like our Father does. He sees our brokenness, pride and arrogance, but he wants us to be with him forever. We must be able to admit where we have fallen short so we can return to the person he created us to be.




