ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1514-1515) teaches that this sacrament is not only for those at the point of death, but for anyone seriously ill or facing serious surgery. In fact, it is preferred that parishioners entering the hospital for surgery should ask the priest for this sacrament before being admitted. Parishioners should never wait until the last minute to call. We encourage parishioners facing surgery to let the parish priest know of their condition before entering the hospital so that they can be anointed before admission.



Shepherd's Corner

I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me

Our first reading today comes from the book of Exodus (17:8-13). This passage talks about a war between the Israelites and Amalek and his army. Now if one was going to wager on who would win, Amalek would be the favorite. He had a stronger army, more infantry men and was more advanced in military tactics than the Israelites. Yet, God says to his people, "Don't worry. I'm taking care of you. Trust in me." So, Moses prayed and lifted his hands in prayer to God. When he prayed, the Israelites would do well in the battle. However, if Moses' hands became tired and sagged, Amalek's army would do better in the battle. So, the people had Moses sit on a rock while two other Israelites supported Moses' arms in prayer. This gave Israel the advantage in the battle, and they eventually won. In those short five verses, I see two important lessons for us.

The first is how Moses is being consistent (and persistent) in his prayer. Even though he, at times, sees the other side winning, he doesn't give up. He remains faithful, trusting in God. I also noticed that God didn't simply make the battle go away, but he helped the Israelites fight against the enemy to win.

The other thing I see in this is the sense of community. Even though Moses had an intimate friendship with God, he still needed the help of others to support his prayer. How often do we take the support of our parish family for granted? I can't tell you how many times visitors will remark to me on what they see here at Good Shepherd: the number of people attending Mass, the music in our liturgy, and the friendliness of our people. All these things work together to build up our faith. We need one another because, as most of us know, life isn't always easy. While people may not literally be holding our arms up in prayer, we support one another by our participation in our Liturgies.

With that said, if you want to get involved in our parish but don't feel you have much time to spare, consider being an usher or a greeter. You're coming to Mass anyway; why not hold the door open and welcome others into God's house? Simply visit one of our staff members at the Welcome Desk in the Narthex after Mass or call our parish office and we can connect you with the right person. Or you can see page 12 of this bulletin on how to get involved in these and other ministries. Christianity shouldn't simply be a "God and me" event, it should be a "God and us" event. We are created in the image of the Trinity; we are created to be in community with one another.
