

A Message from Our Pastor



Dear friends,

We've celebrated another New Year, and I am full of gratitude for all that God has bestowed upon our parish this past year. Good Shepherd is a large and vibrant community—with more than 3,500 people attending Mass each weekend—and it takes each one of us, employees and parishioners alike, to bring God's grace into our corner of the Metroplex.

This past November, we heard an update from our Finance Council after all Masses. Because of their careful oversight, we have been prudent in our spending, increased our savings, maintained a balanced budget, and remained debt free. I am deeply grateful for their commitment and for the

continued generosity that allows us to maintain a strong and stable financial foundation.

While our finances matter, it is ultimately our relationship with God and with one another that reveals the true health and vitality of our parish. The pages that follow will give you a fuller picture of how Good Shepherd is not only nourishing the faith life of our parishioners but also bringing the light of the Gospel into our local community.

This year, our parish family continued to grow in beautiful ways. We welcomed new households, celebrated the sacraments with joy, expanded opportunities for faith formation, and continued our outreach to those in need. Every one of these moments reflects a parish alive with the Holy Spirit and committed to living the Gospel.

One of the delights of the year was seeing our community come together even across oceans. When a group of 45 parishioners traveled to Rome this fall, the Holy Father himself spotted the group after someone held up a White Sox pennant... and offered them a wave—a joyful reminder that our Good Shepherd family is part of the universal Church in a very real way.

Liturgy


2025 was a year of many successfully launched new initiatives in support of liturgy, sacraments, and rites at Good Shepherd.

- Our team implemented “We Adore Him” software, a scheduling tool for Adoration Devotion. We now have over 500 people who have accounts with this program and visit Good Shepherd for Adoration.
- We have made some changes to our Adoration schedule, permanently increasing the hours on Monday through Thursday to be open from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- On the Solemnity of Christ the King, we began a partnership with St. Elizabeth Ann Seton for a Eucharistic Procession. The procession began at Keller Pointe, with Benediction at the Keller Town Hall, and then returned to Keller Pointe.
- We have added another music ensemble to our GSCC Music Ministry, introducing our Teen Choir to the parish in September. This group of Middle School and High School students sings traditional hymns and music at least once per month at one of our weekend liturgies.

Faith Formation

We have been blessed with another amazing year of Faith Formation here at Good Shepherd! Our team of eight continues to live out our mission of accompanying our parishioners in becoming “Spirit-filled evangelizers” (*Evangelii Gaudium* 259) by prioritizing discipleship, fostering a joyful, Christ-centered atmosphere, and developing systems of support for both our staff team and volunteers.

Our **youth and children's ministry** offerings continue to thrive. We have been focusing on strengthening our community in all our youth programming by introducing 6-week celebrations for GSCC Kids and investing more time in small groups for Middle Ministries (our middle school offering) and Renovate (our high school offering). This investment has produced immense fruit – we are averaging higher attendance in all three programs than last year!



We have also focused on **full family engagement** through events for the family unit such as the Advent Mission and the Faith Formation Launch Night. We are also prioritizing opportunities for youth to encounter Christ by equipping our GSCC Kids catechists with creative lesson plans, creating retreat offerings for our middle and high school students, and prioritizing intentional service opportunities for our youth. We have heard many testimonies over the last year from students experiencing the power of Christ's conversion, and we only want that to grow in the coming years!

Middle Ministries Color War & Church Cleaning

On the **adult ministry** front, we have launched many new initiatives that we hope continue to flourish alongside our foundational offerings.

- We launched the Lent Group Challenge, which fed into our Small Church Communities (SCCs) ministry and influenced the formation of 15 new small groups.



Launch Night

- We offered Reach More, a course on equipping parishioners with tools to evangelize, as well as a course on interior freedom.
- We continue to enhance both CRHP and OCIA (formerly RCIA), as well as put together many offerings for adults for both Advent and Lent.

THE GIFT OF COMMUNITY & ST JOSEPH VIRTUES

At Renovate this year, God has been moving in powerful ways as our teens explore what it means to build authentic community and grow in virtue. Through speakers like Noelle Garcia and Jackie Angel, they reflected on community as a gift from God where everyone belongs and where conflict, handled with patience and charity, can lead to deeper unity. We also spent time with the virtues of St. Joseph, guided by presenters who helped our teens understand prudence, modesty, purity, and chastity as virtues that protect their dignity and strengthen their call to holiness. Through it all, the Holy Spirit is forming our teens into young people who choose the good and live confidently in Christ.



ADORATION AND WORSHIP SESSIONS

This semester at Renovate, adoration and praise and worship have become a meaningful rhythm for our teens. Our hour before the Blessed Sacrament the week before Thanksgiving was especially powerful and sparked something deep in many hearts. Since then, students have not only joined us in weekly encouragement toward Eucharistic prayer but have also begun taking time on their own to return to the chapel throughout the week. We've also added praise and worship at 5:30 p.m., creating a space for students to come early, sing together, and prepare their hearts for the night. These practices are drawing our teens into deeper prayer and a growing desire to seek the Lord's presence beyond Wednesday nights.



JOIN US NEXT SEMESTER!

Next semester at Renovate we will enter Phases 3 and 4 of The Gift of Community, focusing on growing in patience with one another, learning how to forgive, and discovering what helps a community truly flourish. We will also reflect on vocation, the call to holiness, and how God invites each person to a unique path. To conclude the semester we will explore evangelization and discipleship, learning how to share the good news of Jesus with courage, joy, and love.

2025 Highlights Include:

- Implementing **Quarterly Connect** events that welcome all parishioners to learn more about our parish community, make new friends, and discover ways to connect to all that Good Shepherd offers.
- Implementing monthly **POWER Nights** for ministry leaders and ministry volunteers to say “Thank You” for serving in ministry and to allow the Holy Spirit to recharge our faithful servants through inspirational keynote speakers and real-life tools for growing in faith and leadership.
- **Parishioner Meet & Greet: Coffee & Donuts** was offered on the first Friday of every month after daily Mass, with more than 60 parishioners gathering and making new friends each month.
- The fun-filled annual **Parish Picnic & Easter Eggstravaganza** saw more than 560 people served, 167 Kona ice cups enjoyed, and more than 2,000 stuffed plastic eggs found by our young parishioners.
- The annual **Oktoberfest**, combined with **Trunk or Treat**, was hugely successful thanks to our generous GSCC parishioner sponsors, Knights of Columbus, Men’s Club, Women’s Group, and Stan Berger on the accordion entertaining the crowd.
- **Family-friendly events** were offered both monthly, such as Knights of Columbus Burritos & Donuts after Sunday Masses, and throughout the year, such as Men’s Club Back to School Breakfast, and Breakfast with St. Nick.
- Parish Staff were and will continue to be available at the **Welcome Desk** after all Masses as a way to connect and engage our visitors and parishioners.
- Parish Staff **served our local community** during GRACE Feed Our Kids Week in June, feeding the homeless of Union Gospel Mission a Thanksgiving Meal in November, and participating in other GSCC Outreach Partner initiatives throughout the year.
- Celebrating two years of faith-filled service with the **GSCC Stewardship Committee** and preparing for exciting changes ahead.

Church HVAC System Replacement - Completed early 2025

This project replaces a total of 9 units. Replacing these units generated over \$48,000 in electricity savings in the fourth quarter of Fiscal Year 2025.

Additions/Conversion of Church Lighting (Completed September 2025) and Dimmer System to LED

We have completed the conversion to LED lights in the Sanctuary, narthex, reconciliation chapel and Marian chapel. We are requesting quotes currently to replace the dimmer system in late 2025 or early 2026.

Update Parish Hall AV system - Completed August 2025

We have replaced the AV system in the Parish Hall and 4 classrooms in the Parish Hall hallway. The new Parish Hall AV system includes several pre-set programs to simplify use of the system.

Church Fire Alarm System

We have replaced the church fire alarm system. There is a small part of the communication system still to be completed. This piece allows the system to communicate through all buildings in the case of an emergency. We anticipate completing the replacement by the end of 2025.
