ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1514-1515) teaches that this sacrament is not only for those at the point of death, but for anyone seriously ill or facing serious surgery. In fact, it is preferred that parishioners entering the hospital for surgery should ask the priest for this sacrament before being admitted. Parishioners should never wait until the last minute to call. We encourage parishioners facing surgery to let the parish priest know of their condition before entering the hospital so that they can be anointed before admission.



Shepherd's Corner

I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me

When I was in 4th or 5th grade, I begged my parents to let me play the saxophone. They said if I was going to play any musical instrument, it had to be something that made music without being in a band. So, they signed me up for accordion lessons. I remember having to practice for a ½ hour each day, but after about a year, the honeymoon phase of learning an instrument wore off. I didn't want to practice daily. Instead, I wanted to be outside hanging out with my friends.

One day, I decided to practice as soon as I got home from school so that this "chore" would be over. After supper, a group of friends came over. As I was going out to play with them, my father stopped me and told me I had to practice the accordion before I could go outside. I told him I already practiced when I came home from school, but he said he didn't hear me practice. So, I had to stay inside and practice *another* ½ hour that day. I was not happy. I remember throwing a tantrum and trying to express to my father how unfair it was that just because he didn't hear me practice doesn't mean I didn't do it. I know I must have whined saying, "this is unfair," while using that pathetic voice that parents have heard since the beginning of time. I wouldn't be surprised if somewhere in that whining, I would have also uttered how unfair I thought he was.

I did that with my father, and I know I have done (and maybe still do) that with God when life doesn't seem fair or I don't seem to get my way. I have my tantrums and whine a lot. That's what we hear in the first reading from the book of Numbers (21:4-5): "With their patience worn out by the journey, the people complained against God and Moses." I think the difference between the people complaining in the desert and the complaining done in some of the Psalms or in the book of Job (or the complaining I did with my dad) is that through sin and selfishness the people in the desert lost their relationship with God. They were serving him out of fear, not love.

God knows my heart. So, if I pretend to be all peaceful and calm when things aren't going my way, yet on the inside I'm filled with anger, that's not an honest relationship. Whether we are talking about faith life, marriage or friendships, I think we all want honesty in the relationships we're in. I know I do and I'm sure God wants honesty as well. When Jesus taught us to pray *The Lord's Prayer*, he told us to call God "Father." We are called to be in relationship with Him as a child is to a parent, not a fearful relationship like slave to Master. May our relationship with God continue to grow in love as we remember He allowed His Son to die so we can live with Him forever.

Oh yeah, and as for the accordion, I certainly wasn't a virtuoso. And sadly, I played like I sing (off key and with no rhythm). But that my dad wanted to listen to me showed me how much he, in fact, loved me!




