 ² Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise! ³ For the LORD is a great God, and a great King above all gods. ⁴ In his hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are his also. ⁵ The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands formed the dry land. ⁶ Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the LORD, our Maker! ⁷ For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand.

- Why is it important for us to understand who God is when it comes to thanksgiving and praise?
- What does it mean for us to be "the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand"? What responsibilities does this place on us?
- **Philippians 4:6-7, ESV** ⁶ do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.
- According to verse 6, our prayer and supplication are to include thanksgiving. Why do you think we must include thanksgiving?
- Why do our hearts and minds need to be guarded? How does God's peace provide this protection?
