- Vs. 3: Are you spiritually humble or do you act superior?
- Vs. 4: Are you spiritually sorrowful or have no shame?
- Vs. 5: Are you known as arrogant rather than humble or meek?
- **Vs. 6:** What pursuits drive your time and attention? Do others see you as hungering after righteousness?
- Vs. 7: Are you seen as harsh rather than merciful?
- Vs. 8: Are you hypocritical in your conduct rather than pure or holy?
- Vs. 9: Are you seen as combative rather than as a peacemaker?
- **Vs. 10-12:** Are you ready and willing to be persecuted? Will you stand for righteousness at personal costs?
