II. WHAT IS DIFFERENT?

Continuity = BEFORE THE CROSS all believe in a lifegiving, sovereign God who fulfills His saving promises

Rom 4:17 - (as it is written, "A father of many nations have I made you") in the presence of Him whom he believed, even God, who gives life to the dead and calls into being that which does not exist.

Discontinuity = AFTER THE CROSS we have faith in Jesus, who died for our sins and was raised for our justification
