# Let There Be Light

And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. And God saw that the light was good.

~ Genesis 1:3-4a

# **Executive Director**

#### From Your Executive Director

Summer is in full swing as I write this. People are taking vacations; schools are about ready to resume following what seems to be a very short summer recess; we've returned to the sanctuary for worship following the light renovation project.

In our annual update meeting, Kyle Allen discussed the work conducted on our strategic planning process, which is continuing. Parish Council has established the goals, and now we are working how to implement those goals for our congregation.

Several years ago, former LCMS president Rev. Gerald Kieschnick made the comment "this is not your grandfather's church," referring to how we as a church body must recognize that the world of 1847, when the LCMS was formed, is not the world of today. Unfortunately, many took his words out of context, stating he wanted to divest the synod of the history of Walther and others, which was not the intent.

Our world has changed so much since 1847. In Indianapolis, for example, none of the 7 pre-WWI German newspapers exist. Our lives were upended by attacks on our country: first Pearl Harbor Day, then on 9/11. Perry Township, which was largely rural up into the 1950s, is now urban. Greenwood has changed from a small town to a thriving bedroom community. Calvary has ridden along with all these changes since its formation as a mission church in 1929, and had to "roll with the punches," so to speak.

We are no longer an isolated suburban church body. We are in a large metropolitan area, and while not an inner-city church, becoming very close to being one. Look at how the city has encroached on our local community, with increases in crime and other symptoms of a large city – including shootings in our immediate area. We are not immune to these changes, and we must adapt our delivery and engagement in the community, while not losing sight of our mission: to Engage People in Christ.

While it's pleasurable to look back at things at Calvary, do any of us want to go back to worshiping in an unairconditioned sanctuary? Or a time when only boys could be acolytes – and had to wear black pants, black shoes, a white shirt and tie while doing so? I know I don't.

Our world is changing. More and more of our younger generation have any belief in God. While our message of preaching Christ Crucified has not and will not change, the way in which we take that message to our community will likely need to change, for us to effectively deliver that message. And the way in which we operate as a church organization may also need to change, to deliver that message in the best manner to an ever-changing world, as we Connect, Learn, and Care to best Serve the Lord in and from Calvary.

#### **SGO Information**

#### Too Good To Be True?!

God has provided a unique opportunity to help fund the Christian education of our Calvary students. The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana has been identified as a new Scholarship Granting Organization. Scholarships through private and corporate donations are granted to Calvary student families whose income is less than 400% of the Federal free or reduced hot lunch guidelines.

#### How may I help?

Donations are currently being accepted. We need \$45,000.00 to fully fund these grants.

# Multiple Benefits for Calvary Lutheran School students, the private or corporate donor, and Calvary Lutheran Church

- 1. Students and their families accepted in this program will receive a scholarship grant per child enrolled in Kindergarten -8<sup>th</sup> grade at Calvary.
- 2. The donor will receive a 50% Indiana State tax credit for every dollar donated. Example: A donation of \$1000.00 will result in a tax credit of \$500.00 towards your Indiana income tax liability. Private as well as corporate donations will receive this benefit.
- 3. The \$45,000.00 received will <u>eliminate</u> the amount of money granted to our students and their families through our own budgeted funds.

#### Where Do I sign up?

Donor forms are available online at <u>www.LutheranSGO.org</u>. Be sure to mark <u>CALVARY LUTHERAN SCHOOL</u> as the recipient of your donation.

#### How Do I Proceed?

Return the completed donor form along with your donation to the School Office or directly to the Lutheran SGO of Indiana by December 31, 2023. The Lutheran SGO of Indiana will issue your tax credit statement for your 2023 tax filing.

#### What happens in the future?

Children receiving a scholarship grant are eligible the following school year to convert this grant to an Indiana CHOICE SCHOLARSHIP. This again significantly reduces the need for congregational funded scholarship dollars.

Children will have the opportunity to hear God's Word each day through your giving. God continues to open doors to others once thought closed due to financial needs. Your assistance in this program is so greatly appreciated!

#### Have you participated in the SGO donation?

Over 65 families have participated in this process by donating nearly \$780,000.00 during the past eleven years. We are asking those past donors to enlist two other families to become involved in this "Too Good to be True" adventure. By donating in the past, you are fully aware of the unique benefits this SGO provides. Please help by talking to at least two other families and enlist their participation as well.
