From the Pastors

Christ is Risen!

⁵ But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. ⁶ He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. ⁷ Then go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead...

What does Easter mean to you? What is its importance and significance for your life today?

We certainly may have many things we like about Easter. Some like the powerful hymns and full church services. Some like the beautiful sight and smell of the Easter lilies beautifying the altar on Easter morning. Some like the church choirs or the time in worship and fellowship with family. Some may like the Easter breakfast or the Easter Egg Hunts at this time of the year.

These are certainly all things to enjoy about Easter, but I don't think that in and of themselves they convey the importance or the meaning of Easter. How might we sum up what Easter means for how we live our lives after Easter Day quickly comes and goes?

Here are a few reflections from others:

- "Easter says you can put truth in a grave, but it won't stay there." ~ Clarence W. Hall
- "Easter was when Hope in person surprised the whole world by coming forward from the future into the present." ~ N.T. Wright
- Let every man and woman count himself immortal. Let him catch the revelation of Jesus in his resurrection. Let him say not merely, 'Christ is risen,' but 'I shall rise.' ~ Phillips Brooks

Easter changes things. More than that, Easter changes us. Easter proclaims the fact that the world was changed by the death and resurrection of Jesus. Not only does it give us strength and joy for the present, but it gives us hope for the future. In these post-Easter times, we celebrate that we live and move and have our being in God's grace and love. But even more than that we live in the hope and promise that this world is going somewhere. God has a bigger plan and a bigger purpose towards which He is working. We do not spend our days living in futility of the short time that we have in the broad sweep of time. No, instead we live in light of the eternity that is promised in the new creation, when Jesus brings forth for us and the world a resurrection and restoration.

In the words of N.T. Wright, "Every act of love, gratitude, and kindness; every work of art or music inspired by the love of God and delight in the beauty of his creation,...every act of care and nurture, of comfort and support, for one's fellow human beings and for that matter one's fellow nonhuman creatures; and of course, every prayer, all Spirit-led teaching, every deed that spreads the gospel, builds up the church, embrace and embodies holiness rather than corruption, and makes the name of Jesus honored in the world—all of this will find its way, **through the resurrecting power of God**, into the new creation that God will one day make. That is the logic of the mission of God. (From Surprised by Hope).

God has big plans for our lives and our futures. He has big plans for this world. Today, we rejoice that today is a new day. And yet, we also know that we wait for the ultimate "new day" when all things shall be resurrected and restored. And so until that time, we as a church have a calling to "Go quickly and tell..." (Mt. 28:7a) We also have a message, "Jesus who was crucified. ... is not here, for he has risen, as he said" (Mt 28:5b, 6). Let us live out His calling and His mission for our church, as we celebrate the hope that is ours in Jesus.



From Your Executive Director

In 2003, the advertising agency R&R Partners presented a proposal to the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority, to brand that city as more than just a gambling destination. "What happens here, stays here." That slogan became one of the most famous taglines in modern tourism marketing, morphing into "What happens in Vegas stays in Vegas." Not only did it serve as a spark to bring tourists to the city, but it also inspired an Usher song, was quipped by former first lady Laura Bush in a response to comedian Jay Leno, was the underlying theme of the three Hangover movies, and closed an Oscar ceremony. And was banned from Super Bowl time slots as well. It served the city well until the October 1, 2017 mass shooting on the Strip, when it was immediately but briefly pulled. It has since been resurrected and is back in use.

Resurrected – what a fabulous way to reference this slogan!

This April, we celebrate Easter, the Resurrection of our LORD. Thought: what if the Vegas slogan had been in use in 1st century Jerusalem? Well, we probably wouldn't recognize it as it would have likely been in Aramaic. Even if the phrase had been in Hebrew – which according to Google Translate is – בירושלים נשאר בירושלים שקורה בירושלים שקורה בירושלים נשאר still be clueless, unless educated in that language, so it would be Greek to us.

(Not really - the Greek is ό,τι συμβαίνει στην Ιερουσαλήμ μένει στην Ιερουσαλήμ.)

But if this slogan had been in use – where would Christianity be today? It wouldn't, as Mary Magdalene and the other Mary wouldn't have said anything to the disciples. Peter and John would never have run to the tomb. If it had even taken root, Christianity would have stayed in Jerusalem, since what happened in Jerusalem stayed in Jerusalem. But thanks be to God that what happened in Jerusalem didn't stay in Jerusalem! Instead, the message of Christ's resurrection spread and was carried throughout the ancient world.

Have we unintentionally and unofficially adopted this motto? Have we decided "what happens at Calvary stays at Calvary" and instead of carrying Christ's Gospel message to our community, are we stopping that at the door as we leave? Are we disengaging ourselves from Christ and our community when we leave the building? Do we, despite our claim that we are Engaging People In Christ, shut down when we are not at church, and keep our faith to ourselves?

Let's not live by the Vegas slogan.

Let's live by the opposite: what happens at Calvary, happens in our community. And the corollary, what happens in the community, happens inside Calvary.

Let's take this Easter message of hope to those outside the church, letting our neighbors and our community know that:

He is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!

Mission Envelope Designation – New LCMS International Mission Initiative

Mission Envelope gifts for the 3rd and 4th quarters of the current fiscal year (Mission Envelopes gifts received from February through July) will be used to provide funding for the new mission initiative being launched by the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod - "We Preach Christ Crucified for All People".

The LCMS National Offering will run from 2023 to 2026 and will support the translation and production of meaningful Lutheran resources in languages other than English, so that all may read, hear and speak the Good News of Christ crucified in a language easily understood. The scale and scope of this translation work will be to the extent made possible by voluntary contributions.

Lutheran Child and Family Services of Indiana/Kentucky, Inc. (LCFS) is a non-profit, 501 (c)3 social service organization founded in 1883 that offers both residential and community-based services to families and children.

The LCFS mission, "Engaging and Empowering Families and Community with Love, Compassion, Faith, and Support", and vision - "Our community will experience safety and stability, in an environment of respect, healing, and hope" exemplify the organization's approach: LCFS engages with clients and empowers them to develop the opportunities, tools, and skills needed to change the trajectory of their lives.

Calvary has had a long and fruitful relationship with LCFS (previously Lutherwood and other previous incarnations of the organization). In addition to direct giving by Calvary from our Mission funds, many Calvary members contribute items and actively volunteer at The Sharing Place – one of the various ministries of LCFS. 

April 2, 2023 – Palm Sunday

Psalm 118:19-29; Philippians 2:5-11; John 12:20-43

"Seeing Jesus" – Sermon Text: John 12:20-21 – Rev. Thomas Eggold

John 3:16 is well-known in the Christian community. But outside of the church, this Bible reference has little meaning, if any. God, through the apostle John, has given us the words we need to clearly proclaim His Gospel message to all.

April 9, 2023 – The Resurrection of Our Lord (Easter Sunrise)

Psalm 118:15-19; 1 Corinthians 15:1-11; John 20:1-18

"Christ Is Risen!" - Sermon Text: John 20:17 - Rev. Dr. Lawrence Rast, Jr.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia. We shout these words joyfully and triumphantly because the resurrection of Jesus shows us that the work of salvation is complete. As those he has called by name, we rejoice that we, too, will rise, just as he did.

April 16, 2023 – 2nd Sunday of Easter
