What is one thing that the people of Calvary can keep in their prayers for your area of ministry?



Executive Director

From Your Executive Director

It's difficult to believe it's already September. It seems like just yesterday I was planting flowers and getting ready for summer. But like we read in Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, there is a time for everything, and this is a time of change.

September is a transition month, a month of change. If one looks at the calendar, the first day of fall (the Autumnal Equinox) is the 23rd of this month. The Old Farmer's Almanac is even more precise: it arrives at 2:50 EDT in the Northern Hemisphere, when the Sun crosses the equator going from north to south. Set your alarm to celebrate.

There is also a meteorological Autumn, which begins September 1st. This is the date the NWS and other weather services consider the start of Fall. Take your pick which to use. I am a traditionalist, so I use the Autumnal Equinox date.

There are other changes taking place this time of year, besides the weather. All our schools, colleges, and universities are now back in session. The first full moon nearest the equinox date is the "Harvest Moon." Like the song. Leaves begin to change colors, and certain plants like chrysanthemums and asters bloom.

Calvary is not immune to changes, either. Over the past year, your Parish Council and leaders have been working to establish a strategic plan for Calvary's future, recognizing the many changes that have taken place both inside our congregation and outside in our community. I've had many discussions with our leaders, providing them with probably more reading materials and resources than they want, of what we see taking place outside our doors.

As your Council and leaders have worked through this process, it became clear to us that Calvary has many blessings. We are fortunate to have a vibrant, active, and engaged body of Christ here at Calvary, one with dreams and ideas of how we Engage People In Christ, both in the congregation and in our community.

We are thrilled with what the future holds for Calvary, as we work to Connect, Learn, and Care for others, to take the Gospel outside our doors into our community, to bring people to Christ, to help our members grow in their Christian faith. Never changing our message though: we have always stayed true to our roots of preaching Christ Crucified, and the Solas of the Lutheran belief: Sola Scriptura, Sola Fide, Sola Gratia. We remain adherent to the Augsburg Confession and all other writings in the Book of Concord, knowing we are saved by faith alone. And while saved by faith, we also know we should share that message with others, serving those less fortunate: not because we have to, but because Christ has set us free to do so!

There will be a special meeting of the congregation to lay out these plans developed by the leaders, and how we implement them at Calvary, realizing that as we do so, we must and will change how we operate as a congregation, to better use our resources and blessings.

Scholarship Tax Credit Information

"Too Good to Be True?!"

The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana, Inc. has been identified as a Scholarship Granting Organization. LCMS Mission Support

One of the functions of the Stewardship Ministry Team is to administer funds that Calvary has designated for missions and projects that are external to our church community. Currently Calvary is providing funds to two missionary families that are serving in West Africa – the Schulte family and the Wolf family.

Reverend Gary Schulte and his wife Stephanie are the first missionaries that the LCMS has placed in the Congo. LCMS Disaster Response – Lutherans Assisting in the Wake of Maui Fires

As part of our support of external ministry support, Calvary provides an annual gift to the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod's Disaster Response Ministry. As noted in the June Calvary Newsletter, this year Stewardship designated a gift of \$2,000 to this "ministry of caring". The LCMS Disaster Response ministry responds to immediate and long-term needs following natural and man-made disasters. Working through LCMS districts and congregations as well as with international Lutheran churches and other partners, LCMS Disaster Response builds capacity of the church's partners to respond to needs with Christian care. In response to the tragic fire in Lāhainā on the island of Maui, Hawaii, LCMS pastors and other volunteers are on the ground providing spiritual and counseling care. In addition, members of Emmanuel Lutheran Church and School on Maui are responding to the disaster by helping provide for the immediate needs of those affected and by assisting those who are providing housing for the displaced.
