

Haitian American Friendship Foundation's ministries include academic education, theological education, community development and mercy ministries. Academics are primarily through HAFF's large Christian secondary school (BTI). Theological education, extension and outreach is offered through pastors/church leaders classes at BTI, Scripture memory and Bible distribution programs, and the Jesus Film Project. Community development and education is a major component of HAFF's work. HAFF operates a

medical and dental clinic on its campus as well as taking those services to other parts of the plateau.

THIRD MILLENNIUM MINISTRIES



Dr. Richard L. Pratt, Jr., helped to launch Third Millennium Ministries in response to the lack of training of Christian leaders around the world. He believed that any person that had the desire to learn more about the Bible should be given that opportunity. Furthermore, it should be accessible, in their own language, and at no cost to them.

Third Mill is accomplishing that goal by building a multimedia seminary curriculum in English, Arabic, Chinese (Mandarin), Russian and Spanish. These lessons are recorded and designed in house and are similar to the style of what one might see on the History Channel.

Instructors are seminary professors and theologically trained educators. In addition, all translators are theologically astute native speakers of their language.
