Scripture Lesson

We hear and read Holy Scripture throughout the service. Listen to this reading (lesson) to prepare for the sermon.

Prayer of the Church

Scripture Lesson

We hear and read Holy Scripture throughout the service. Follow along with this text (lesson) that directs the sermon. the love of Christ controls us, because we have concluded this: that one has died for all, therefore all have died; ¹⁵ and he died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised.

¹⁶ From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we once regarded Christ according to the flesh, we regard him thus no longer. ¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.



"I am the clinical and rehab supervisor for BethanyKids. In this role, I am responsible for mentoring and training all of the therapists and rehab-related staff for BethanyKids. Another aspect of my work is with the mobile clinic team. Our team treats nearly 4,000 patients per year. One of the unique things about therapy is that often we require a significant number of return visits and with this, we can create a strong relationship with our families. CPC MEDICAL MISSIONARIES IN INDIA

Sujai and Lavanya Suneetha are doctors who serve in Andhra Pradesh, India. After years of ministry among lepers in India, they responded to God's call to minister to those infected and affected by HIV/AIDS (India's lowest "caste").

Nireekshana ACET (AIDS Care, Education & Treatment) is a community based organization dedicated to the Christ-like compassionate care and support of people living with HIV/AIDS and leprosy using a holistic approach. This work is based in the medical clinics and in community outreach. It's key work focus is on providing counselling, medical care, training and empowerment of women, socio-economic, spiritual care and support.
