The book *Covenant Baptism* by Jason Helopoulos is very helpful resource for you to consider the questions you may have about baptism. It is a brief, practical overview of baptism that explains the link between covenant baptism and the Old Testament practice of circumcision; it also contrasts the practices of sprinkling and immersion.

## CPC MISSIONARIES IN INDIA

Sujai and Lavanya are doctors who serve with Nireekshana in Telangana, India. Nireekshana ACET (AIDS Care, Education, & Treatment) is a community based organization dedicated to the Christ-like compassionate care and support of people living with HIV/AIDS and leprosy using a holistic approach. This work is based in the medical clinics and in community outreach. It's focus is on providing counselling, medical care, the training and empowerment of women, and socioeconomic, spiritual care, and support. Now, through a main clinic and an additional satellite clinic, Nireekshana caters to the needs of hundreds of individuals and families affected by HIV and leprosy each month.

## CPC MISSIONARIES WITH EQUIPPING LEADERS INTERNATIONAL

Dan and Mako serve with Equipping Leaders International (ELI). ELI partners with under-resourced Christian leaders from around the world to equip and multiply Biblically mature Christian leaders for every area of community life. Dan serves full -time with his primary responsibility being three training partnerships (in Ghana, Kenya, and Tanzania). He also receives and processes requests from prospective faculty members and Christian leaders seeking leadership training partnerships. In addition to her full-time responsibilities as a mother and registrar at a local school, Mako is responsible for ELI's social media communications.

Please pray for them and this ministry in these particular ways:

- For the nearly 100 Christian leaders and their families in the three leadership networks we serve in Kenya (as well as another four or five networks in other parts of Kenya, plus others in East Africa) who are struggling in the midst of an on-going drought, now exacerbated by effects of Russia's war in Ukraine
