Private Confession of Sin

Invocation

This prayer addresses God in three persons, asking Him to be present with us in worship to help us worship Him according to His will.

Call to Confession

As we see God in His invitation and our praise, we cannot help but see how we have fallen short. God's Holy Scripture has the authority to reveal us to ourselves and transition our hearts to confession.

Corporate Confession of Sin

We sin in thought, word, and deed every week. This prayer begins with silent confession, followed by corporate confession as people equally in need of God's grace.

Assurance of Pardon

Holy Scripture assures Christians, sinners saved by grace, that they are united to Jesus in His death and resurrection.

Scripture Lesson

We hear and read Holy Scripture throughout the service. Listen to this reading (lesson) to prepare for the sermon.

Presentation of Tithes & Offerings

We set aside a tithe and additional offering of our resources for the purposes of God, for His glory. Both are a display of our joyful dependence upon God rather than ourselves.

Doxology

A doxology is a hymn or word of praise to God for His goodness and glory. The *Gloria Patri* is another example of a doxology.

Prayer of the Church

We share in our health and sickness, happiness and sorrow, assurance and doubt, as we bring our prayers to God, together. Holy Scripture commands elders to pray with and for God's people, not just publicly, but privately.

SERMON NOTES

Title: Walking in the Light **Text:** Ephesians 5.8-14

Intro: The responsibilities of walking as children of light cut across the grain of culture in every ageincluding our own. In our progress of putting off the ways of thinking and behaving that belong to our old lives as darkness and putting on those that belong to our new lives as light, we struggle. Don't we sometimes read the strong imperatives of Scripture and wonder, "Is this realistic? Is this even possible?" Paul dispels the darkness of that old way of thinking by telling us, "Yes, it is practical and realistic because by God's grace and power you are no longer children of darkness, you are children of light. Therefore *walk as children of light.*"

SPRING SUNDAY SCHOOL

Visitor's Class: Led by Interim Senior Pastor Bill Massey | Room 105

This class is designed for visitors who wish to learn more about Covenant. This class addresses our distinctive life, doctrine, and worship as a conservative, Presbyterian, and Reformed church. The Visitor's Class is a temporary class before finding your long-term Sunday school class.

College-Age/Career Class: Led by Tim & Bonnie Schoap | Room 208

Study: Eschatology, the theology of Jesus' Second Coming, "Your Kingdom Come." This class will undertake a general overview of the book of Revelation and look at the various understandings of Jesus' return from different denominations across the ages with an eye to the practical, foundational importance of this critical area of Christian belief.

Sermon on the Mount: Led by John Harris | Room 120

This class will be a facilitated teaching series by Sinclair Ferguson on the Sermon on the Mount, which will include video lessons by Sinclair Ferguson, along with class discussion. This mixed adult class of all ages is open to everyone.

The Church of the Middle Ages: Led by Dee Hobbs | Room 150 (Choir Room)

This study of the medieval church traces the growth of the faith from the 6th century through the time of the Reformation. Many critical events transpired during this period that have impacted the life of the Church until this very time. This is a mixed adult class that is open to everyone.

Joel: Led by Judy Foster, Christine Morrison, and Lois Crenshaw | Room 119 Judah, the setting for the book, is devastated by a vast horde of locusts, which destroy everything - the fields of grain, the vineyards, the gardens, and the trees. Joel symbolically describes the locusts as a marching human army and views all of this as divine judgment coming against the nation for her sins. This is a ladies-only class.

The Life of Moses: Led by Ken Henry | Rooms 121-122

This class will study the life of Moses as well as selected passages throughout the Pentateuch. Additionally, this class will look at the culture of ancient Egypt and the impact of Moses on our understanding of Christ and the New Testament. This mixed adult class of all ages is open to everyone.

The Gospel of Mark/Romans: Led by Dr. Lamar Allen | Room 100

The last four chapters of Mark cover the Olivet Discourse, Jesus' arrest and trial, His sentence to death on the cross, the crucifixion, resurrection, actions between resurrection and ascension, and ascension. Following the completion of Mark, this class will begin Romans. Class recordings and outlines are available below. This is a mixed adult class of all ages and is open to everyone.
