Woodlands Gathering is a part of the TN Valley Presbytery's church planting movement.



FALL SUNDAY SCHOOL

New Member's Class: Led by Interim Senior Pastor Bill Massey | Room 120

This is an ongoing class designed for visitors who wish to learn more about Covenant. It addresses our distinctive life, doctrine, and worship as a conservative, Presbyterian, and Reformed church. The New Member's Class is a temporary class before finding your long-term Sunday school class.

College-Age/Career Class: Led by Tim & Bonnie Schoap | Room 208

Study: "Confronting Christianity" This study, written by Rebecca McLaughlin, explores 12 issues that are often seen as obstacles to faith, including the reality of suffering, the complexity of modern sexuality and gender, and the reliability of Scripture.

Book of Job: Led by Jon Harris | Rooms 121-122

This class is studying the book of Job using a book by Christopher Ash (*Trusting God in the Darkness: A Guide to Understanding the Book of Job*) as a guide and a resource for those in the class who want to read along. This is a mixed adult class that is open to everyone.

The Reformation: led by Dan Steere, Bill Higgins, and Dee Hobbs | Room 150 (Choir Room) Have you ever wondered why American Christians are so prone to look to the government for help in doing the work of the Kingdom? The English Reformation is of particular importance to us because much of how we "do church" is inherited from England. This is a mixed adult class that is open to everyone.

Zephaniah Led by Judy Foster, Christine Morrison, and Lois Crenshaw | Room 119 Zephaniah forces us to hold two aspects of God's character at once—His justice and His love—to see that together they contain the future hope for our world. This is a ladies-only class.

The Life of Moses: Led by Ken Henry | Room 100

This class will study the life of Moses as well as selected passages throughout the Pentateuch. Additionally, this class will look at the culture of ancient Egypt and the impact of Moses on our understanding of Christ and the New Testament. This mixed adult class of all ages is open to everyone.

Romans: Led by Dr. Lamar Allen | Room 105

The epistle to the Romans has profoundly affected those who read it. Many have been converted by its message including Augustine, Martin Luther, and John Wesley. Martin Luther wrote that "...Romans is the true masterpiece of the New Testament and the very purest Gospel, and is worthy not only that every Christian should know it word for word, by heart, but occupy himself with it every day, as the daily bread of the soul." This is a mixed adult class that is open to everyone.
