As we see God in His invitation and our praise, we cannot help but see how we have fallen short. God's Holy Scripture has the authority to reveal us to ourselves and transition our hearts to confession.

Corporate Confession of Sin

We sin in thought, word, and deed every week. This prayer begins with silent confession, followed by corporate confession as people equally in need of God's grace.

Assurance of Pardon

Holy Scripture assures Christians, sinners saved by grace, that they are united to Jesus in His death and resurrection.

Scripture Lesson

We hear and read Holy Scripture throughout the service. Listen to this reading (lesson) to prepare for the sermon.

Baptism

In baptism, ordinary water represents God's work in the covenant of grace to forgive sins through Spiritual washing and the blood of Jesus. It cannot save. It symbolizes that we belong to Jesus and is commanded of every Christian. A child of Christian parents may be baptized because "household" baptism of the New Testament is similar to circumcision of the Old Testament.

Presentation of Tithes & Offerings

We set aside a tithe and additional offering of our resources for the purposes of God, for His glory. Both are a display of our joyful dependence upon God rather than ourselves.

Doxology

A doxology is a hymn or word of praise to God for His goodness and glory. The *Gloria Patri* is another example of a doxology.

Prayer of the Church

We share in our health and sickness, happiness and sorrow, assurance and doubt, as we bring our prayers to God, together. Holy Scripture commands elders to pray with and for God's people, not just publicly, but privately.

SERMON NOTES

Title: Radical Purity **Text:** Matthew 5.27-30

Intro: Many Christians have made a shipwreck of their faith because they never learned how to deal effectively with this kind of temptation. Worse, perhaps, they have been encouraged to see it as irrelevant. Other issues in our world seem far more urgent. What about the threat of terrorism? What about reconciliation between the races? Does it really matter that much what I do with my mind or my body? Surely sexual sin, if it's really a sin, is only a sin with a small "s." But Jesus says in the plainest language possible that no person can be His disciple who is unwilling to take up his or her cross daily and put their lusts to death. He calls us to radical purity.



Nireekshana is a community-based organization dedicated to Christ-like compassionate care and support of people living with HIV/AIDS and leprosy using a holistic approach. Its focus is on providing counselling, medical care, the training and empowerment of women (socio-economic and spiritual care/support). Now, through a main clinic and an additional satellite clinic, Nireekshana caters to the needs of hundreds of individuals and families affected by HIV and leprosy each month.
