Corporate Confession of Sin

We sin in thought, word, and deed every week. This prayer begins with silent confession, followed by corporate confession as people equally in need of God's grace.

Assurance of Pardon

Holy Scripture assures Christians, sinners saved by grace, that they are united to Jesus in His death and resurrection.

Scripture Lesson

We hear and read Holy Scripture throughout the service. Listen to this reading (lesson) to prepare for the sermon.

Baptism

In baptism, ordinary water represents God's work in the covenant of grace to forgive sins through Spiritual washing and the blood of Jesus. It cannot save. It symbolizes that we belong to Jesus and is commanded of every Christian. A child of Christian parents may be baptized because "household" baptism of the New Testament is similar to circumcision of the Old Testament.

Presentation of Tithes & Offerings

We set aside a tithe and additional offering of our resources for the purposes of God, for His glory. Both are a display of our joyful dependence upon God rather than ourselves.

Doxology

A doxology is a hymn or word of praise to God for His goodness and glory. The *Gloria Patri* is another example of a doxology.

Prayer of the Church

We share in our health and sickness, happiness and sorrow, assurance and doubt, as we bring our prayers to God, together. Holy Scripture commands elders to pray with and for God's people, not just publicly, but privately.

LEADER: This is the Word of the Lord.

PEOPLE: Thanks be to God.

SERMON NOTES

Title: The Blood of Christ **Text:** Hebrews 9.11-14

Intro: What stimulates our willing service of God and others? There are a number of things but chief among them is keeping the blood of Christ central in our minds. Verse 14 says the blood of Christ is able to purify our consciences from dead works to serve the living God. That may sound strange to you, so think about it like this - Knowing that the blood of Christ has completely opened the way to God for us, and then coming regularly to God by faith in that blood to fellowship with Him and for help in serving Him and others, enables us know God's presence and acceptance and strength despite all of our daily failings. God's love to us in Christ, proven by the sacrifice of our Savior's blood, prompts our patient love and generosity. As the Apostle said, "We love because God first loved us."


