Scripture Lesson

Chattanooga Sports Ministries

Ministry Focus:

CSM reaches a large number of kids ages 8-18 throughout our summer soccer program. In recent years, we have also added a fall and spring after-school soccer program. CSM focuses on the neighborhoods of East Chattanooga, Westside, Highland Park, East Lake, and Wheeler Homes. CSM serves a very diverse group of youth including kids from Latino, African American, and Caucasian backgrounds.
