Doxology

A doxology is a hymn or word of praise to God for His goodness and glory. The *Gloria Patri* is another example of a doxology.

Prayer of the Church

Scripture Lesson

We hear and read Holy Scripture throughout the service. Follow along with this text (lesson) that directs the sermon. apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, ²¹ in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord. ²² In him you also are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit.


Benediction

SERMON NOTES

Title: Built Together in Christ **Text:** Ephesians 2.19-22

Intro: In this passage, the Apostle Paul continues to explain a believer's union with Christ. As followers of Christ, we have been reconciled to God. God has killed the hostility between Himself and His people. Paul explains that this work and union has brought both Jew and Gentile together as citizens of a new kingdom. Despite vastly different cultures, histories, and even enmities, God has given a new identity to all who belong to Jesus. In Christ, those who were once far off are being built together as God's dwelling place among the nations.



- 1. We are desired--being brought into a large family. (vv. 19-20)
- 2. We are secure--built on a formational cornerstone. (v. 20)
- 3. We are valued--joined as a holy temple. (vv. 21-22)






