Call to Confession

As we see God in His invitation and our praise, we cannot help but see how we have fallen short. God's Holy Scripture has the authority to reveal us to ourselves and transition our hearts to confession.

Corporate Confession of Sin

We sin in thought, word, and deed every week. This prayer begins with silent confession, followed by corporate confession as people equally in need of God's grace.

Assurance of Pardon

Holy Scripture assures Christians, sinners saved by grace, that they are united to Jesus in His death and resurrection.

Scripture Lesson

We hear and read Holy Scripture throughout the service. Listen to this reading (lesson) to prepare for the sermon.

Baptism

In baptism, ordinary water represents God's work in the covenant of grace to forgive sins through Spiritual washing and the blood of Jesus. It cannot save. It symbolizes that we belong to Jesus and is commanded of every Christian. A child of Christian parents may be baptized because "household" baptism of the New Testament is similar to circumcision of the Old Testament.

Presentation of Tithes & Offerings

We set aside a tithe and additional offering of our resources for the purposes of God, for His glory. Both are a display of our joyful dependence upon God rather than ourselves.

Doxology

A doxology is a hymn or word of praise to God for His goodness and glory. The *Gloria Patri* is another example of a doxology.

Prayer of the Church

We share in our health and sickness, happiness and sorrow, assurance and doubt, as we bring our prayers to God, together. Holy Scripture commands elders to pray with and for God's people, not just publicly, but privately.

SERMON NOTES

Title: A New Life for the Old **Text**: Ephesians 4.17-24

Intro: Out of his great concern for our souls, Paul marks out the path of life and *fulness* for us--the way of righteousness and holiness. How many, even of those who profess faith in Christ, believe that a life of holiness must inevitably lead to settling for less happiness than can be gained by going our own way! But that is the unbelieving mind's misunderstanding and the way of *futility*. God's way ultimately leads to the knowledge of His love which surpasses understanding and is better than life itself. To help us grasp this truth, Paul contrasts two ways of living in this passage:

OUTREACH

VOLUNTEERS IN MEDICINE. CHATTANOOGA



Volunteers in Medicine, Chattanooga (VIM Chattanooga) is a faith-based primary care clinic. Volunteer physicians and nurses provide free medical services to financially eligible adults who are uninsured. The mission of the VIM Chattanooga Clinic is to understand and serve the health and wellness needs of the medically underserved in our community by providing quality, compassionate, and personalized care in a caring faith-based environment.

From their recent letter, they report that our support has helped volunteers "touch the lives of 78,000 neighbors since 2005 - whether they were facing an urgent need, a devastating disease, or seeking to improve quality of life. The value of the care provided by volunteers is greater than \$27 million (clinic rates) and \$112 million at ER rates, at a cost of nearly \$10 million to VIM."
