# ALLIANCE STAMP MINISTRY

For many years now, during the Christmas season especially, we remind you to save the stamps you receive in the mail. Some members save them throughout the year. They trickle in by fives or tens, but sometimes they come in by bulging bags full. Do you ever wonder what becomes of those stamps that the church asks you to collect?

The Alliance Stamp Ministry in Fort Myers, Florida, has found a way to turn ordinary postage stamps into a resource for spreading the gospel. They turn what most of us throw away as trash into income to help advance God's Kingdom. This ministry is based out of Shell Point Retirement Community. Below are edited excerpts from a Fort Myers' The News Press article that will explain how this started and happens:

For 50 years, Shell Point volunteers have gathered, sorted, clipped, and placed untold numbers of canceled stamps into plastic bins. This sounds like busy work and a way for a bunch of senior citizens to get out and socialize. "You can't believe the number of problems we've solved in here," joked group leader Treva Crump. They've also solved a big one when it comes to spreading God's Word.

By doing this simple yet laborious task, the Alliance Stamp Ministry in July 2018 passed the \$1 million mark in money raised for the publication of Sunday School material and sharing of God's Word on radio in Central and South America. Ben Crump, Treva's husband, calls it "doing the Lord's work."

Shell Point has a long history of being a haven for religious and spiritual leaders. The community has been home for retired pastors and missionaries almost from its opening 54 years ago.

Dr. Robert Searing, the stamp ministry's original founder, came to Shell Point in 1971. He brought his business with him. In the old days, he and his employees soaked the licked stamps off paper, sorted, and sold them. Working with the H.R. Harris Stamp Company, profits made supported H.C.J.B., a Christian radio station that reached into Central and South America. A total of \$4,100 was raised that first year. Word quickly spread to local and national churches as well as other organizations, which sent canceled stamps to the group's headquarters.

Radio time became so expensive that missionaries in Argentina asked if the monies sent could be used for the publication of Sunday School material. They agreed, and Publicaciones Alianza in Buenos Aires now prints the materials

The trimmed and sorted stamps are sold to collectors in 25-pound boxes.
