Matthew 6.25-34 (p. 811)

²⁵ Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? ²⁶ Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? ²⁷ And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? 28 And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, ²⁹ yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. ³⁰ But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? ³¹ Therefore do not be anxious, saying, "What shall we eat?" or "What shall we drink?" or "What shall we wear?" 32 For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. 33 But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

Sermon Notes

Title: Do Not Be Anxious Text: Matthew 6.25-34

Intro: Notice how extensive our Lord's treatment of anxiety is in this part of the Sermon on the Mount. The Lord knows us! This is where we struggle. But the Lord also knows that if we are not confident of our Father's provision, it will hurt our ability to walk with Him faithfully. We won't believe that God will provide all we need to glorify Him in those places He has put us. Our witness will be compromised by the littleness of our faith. Because our God is an attentive Father who provides for the whole world, He feeds the birds of the air. He clothes the lilies of the field. Isn't He willing and able to do far more for us who are His children?



David & Eowyn Stoddard

David and Eowyn serve with Mission to the World (MTW) in Munich, Germany. They see this city as a place where evangelism, church-planting, and discipleship can couple with coaching/leadership development and theological education in Germany. Recently they wrote: "We see encouraging fruit in our church plant. Two weeks ago, our church celebrated two baptisms for which we are very grateful. One of the unique ministries of this church-plant is a Sunday School class (not typical for a German church)...there are three small group Bible studies, all going through the book of Galatians this fall...The Spirit is doing something in Munich because there are unbelievers who are

Paul Billy and Shirley serve with Presbyterian Mission International in Bangalore, India. Their ministry focuses on helping to establish Reformed churches throughout southern India. This ministry teaches national pastors and evangelists who have no formal training. In a recent update, Paul Billy shared this excerpt: "Praise God with us for the joy of fruit, eyes being opened to the message of hope as we preach and teach the gospel of grace in the face of aggressive persecution, interference, hardship, and living life in our fallen world. By God's grace we are doing well and never take this for granted living in the times we do under government scrutiny and the close watch of those against the spread of the gospel in India who work aggressively to

discredit and miss inform our people of our land."
