

Doxology

A doxology is a hymn or word of praise to God for His goodness and glory. The *Gloria Patri* is another example of a doxology.

Prayer of the Church

¹² And after the deportation to Babylon: Jechoniah was the father of Shealtiel, and Shealtiel the father of Zerubbabel, ¹³ and Zerubbabel the father of Abiud, and Abiud the father of Eliakim, and Eliakim the father of Azor, ¹⁴ and Azor the father of Zadok, and Zadok the father of Achim, and Achim the father of Eliud, ¹⁵ and Eliud the father of Eleazar, and Eleazar the father of Matthan, and Matthan the father of Jacob, ¹⁶ and Jacob the father of Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born, who is called Christ.



SERMON NOTES

Title: The Hopes and Fears of All the Years

Text: Matthew 1.1-17

Intro: Matthew's genealogy moves forward from Abraham to Jesus rather than backwards from Jesus (as in Luke 3.23-38). Why? Matthew's point is this: from the very beginning, God knew exactly where He was going. Throughout the centuries, He was directing history towards this glorious moment. Despite His people's failures and trials, despite world-wide upheavals (think of the Babylonian exile), the longest standing and most difficult to keep promise of God had really come to fulfillment!



AGAPE PUPPETS

A^{the}ape Puppets



Linda Summer, director

Each year, Agape Puppets shares the true love of Jesus Christ with over 70,000 children, teenagers, and adults across five continents. In recent updates this fall, Linda Summer shared this about recent ministry in Egypt: "Every day we heard the Muslim call to prayer. We worked in churches that were built nearly a thousand years ago...In the traffic of Cairo, we still saw donkeys! I will remember the children I saw on the streets. I will remember looking into the eyes of seas of children and praying that they would trust in Jesus. Many people would think that poverty is the greatest problem, but their greatest problem is also our greatest problem: We all need Jesus! [At] three women's conferences, we had the opportunity to share with hundreds of mothers, grandmothers, and young women. We also had many children at every

program, so we included a shortened puppet show during these conferences. At these shows and conferences, we heard hundreds of women and children ask Jesus to rescue them!"

CPC MISSIONARIES TO FRANCE

Pete and Ruth serve in Toulouse, France with Mission to the World (MTW). This fall, they have seen encouraging growth in some of their outreaches in their community (a children's rally, Bible study on John, and a Reformation celebration). They have also witnessed church members under spiritual attack and their community hosting a "Door of Darkness" festival that has echoes of demonic symbolism. Pete and Ruth recently wrote, "It's been pretty gloomy and rainy over here in France. We've had floods in certain regions similar to those in North Carolina. Church attendance has been low as it's school vacation...yet David calls us to praise God because your loving kindness is better than life! It is our spiritual

life, and that is better than our temporal life. It's so easy to get caught up with what we have or don't have." Please pray for them and their ministry in these particular ways:

- For their adult children and their families who are stateside
- For couples in church plant who need to reconcile, learn to forgive
