# MISSION TO THE WORLD (MTW)

MTW is the global missions-sending agency of the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA). MTW sends nearly 700 Christian workers to 102 countries all over the world who are committed to the establishment, growth, and maturity of the church. All that they do flows into, rests within, or flow out of the local church.

For example, establishing a new church might require people who can teach local leaders, or evangelize through sports ministry, or provide a medical clinic. These ways of serving can reach and equip future leaders and build connections in the community. They work with national partners to help strengthen this endeavor.

Serving within the church would be church planters, assistant pastors, disciplers, teachers, and others who directly support the growth and maturity of the church.

Flowing out of a healthy, growing church will be ministries that transform the community and continue to draw others to the gospel message, such as teaching English, caring for orphans, art and music outreach, or serving refugees.
