1. The Promise

Exodus 1:6-7—Then Joseph died, and all his brothers and all that generation. But the people of Israel were fruitful and increased greatly; they multiplied and grew exceedingly strong, so that the land was filled with them.

2. The Problem

Exodus 1:8-10—Now there arose a new king over Egypt, who did not know Joseph. And he said to his people, “Behold, the people of Israel are too many and too mighty for us. Come, let us deal shrewdly with them, lest they multiply, and, if war breaks out, they join our enemies and fight against us and escape from the land.”

3. The Pain

Exodus 1:11-14—Therefore they set taskmasters over them to afflict them with heavy burdens...But the more they were oppressed, the more they multiplied and the more they spread abroad. And the Egyptians were in dread of the people of Israel. So they ruthlessly made the people of Israel work as slaves and made their lives bitter with hard service, in mortar and brick, and in all kinds of work in the field. In all their work they ruthlessly made them work as slaves.

4. The Plan

Exodus 1:15-16, 22—Then the king of Egypt said to the Hebrew midwives...“When you serve as midwife to the Hebrew women... if it is a son, you shall kill him, but if it is a daughter, she shall live.”...Then Pharaoh commanded all his people, “Every son that is born to the Hebrews you shall cast into the Nile...”

5. The Providence

Exodus 1:17, 2:2,10—But the midwives feared God and did not do as the king of Egypt commanded them, but let the male children live... The woman conceived and bore a son...She named him Moses.
