

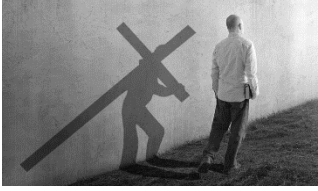
Sunday AM Sermon – April 16, 2023
