3. Andrew mentioned that practicing Heart Attitude #3 is a risk. What are some of the risks?

4. What are some of the ways putting the goals and interests of others above my own (HA1) and living an honest and open life (HA2) allow for Heart Attitude #3 to happen?

5. Read Hebrews 3:12-13. What do these verses reveal about our hearts?

- In Verse 13, "encourage" (NIV) or "exhort" (ESV) translates a Greek word which basically means "to urge a person toward some future conduct." As we consider correcting another person, our concern is not simply correcting a past wrong but to help them build a better future. Why is this important to remember when you are considering offering correction?
