Dear Church Family,

I've said it before, but I'll say it again: no one I know is *good* at prayer. What I mean is, no one I know thinks their prayer life is outstanding (maybe you do). Most Christians I know wish they prayed more often, more consistently, and with greater motivation. As one author I read recently said (I can't remember who), "No Christian will get to the end of their life and wish they had prayed *less*." It will always be my aim as a follower of Jesus to grow in prayer.

Yet, I'm also a realist when it comes to prayer. At least I know I'm in good company with the disciples whose spirit was willing, but whose flesh was weak, for I too have been known to doze off when attempting to pray (Mk. 14:40).

So, rather than try to run a prayer-athon, maybe it's better keep things short.

As a pastor-friend of mine used to say, "Don't hear what I'm not saying." I'm not suggesting we lower the bar. I'm simply reminding you (and me) that prayer is not a competition; it's a conversation.

That's why I'm a big fan of one-minute prayers. What's a one-minute prayer? It's a prayer that takes you 60 seconds to pray. Sixty seconds doesn't sound like a lot, but do you know what it's longer than? Zero seconds. I'd rather take 60 seconds to pray than not pray at all.

Need Scripture to back this up? Check out this passage from Nehemiah.

"In the month of Nisan in the twentieth year of King Artaxerxes, when wine was brought for him, I took the wine and gave it to the king. I had not been sad in his presence before, so the king asked me, "Why does your face look so sad when you are not ill? This can be nothing but sadness of heart." I was very much afraid, but I said to the king, "May the king live forever! Why should my face not look sad when the city where my ancestors are buried lies in ruins, and its gates have been destroyed by fire?" The king said to me, "What is it you want?" Then I prayed to the God of heaven, and I answered the king, "If it pleases the king and if your servant has found favor in his sight, let him send me to the city in Judah where my ancestors are buried so that I can rebuild it" (Neh. 2:1-5, NIV).

How long do you think Nehemiah's prayer lasted? One minute? Thirty seconds? Maybe 10? I bet he prayed something like this: "Okay, God. Grant me favor before the king. Here goes. Amen." Just a few seconds long. And you know what? God answered that prayer.

I don't understand how prayer-math works. If I set aside 15 minutes to pray, I usually run out of things to say after about 3 minutes—a 20% success rate. But if I commit to praying for 60 seconds, I often find myself praying for 5-10 minutes—or more!

So here goes. Today, let's take 60 seconds to pray. Pray for any (or all) of the following:

- 1. Take 60 seconds to thank God for his goodness, grace, and mercy.
- 2. Take 60 seconds to pray for a pastor or ministry leader.
- 3. Take 60 seconds to pray about your prayer life.
- 4. Take 60 seconds for boldness to share your faith.
- 5. Take 60 seconds to pray for our church.
- 6. Take 60 seconds to pray for a different church.
- 7. Take 60 seconds to pray for a student you know.
- 8. Take 60 seconds to pray for a Global Partner.
- 9. Take 60 seconds and pray for VBS this summer.
- 10. Take 60 seconds and pray for our church finances.
- 11. Take 60 seconds and pray for our country.
- 12. Take 60 seconds and pray for a different country.
- 13. Take 60 seconds and pray for our Summer Outreach opportunities.
- 14. Take 60 seconds and pray for the campers and staff at Camp Oak Hills.
- 15. Take 60 seconds to pray for an enemy.
- 16. Take 60 seconds and pray for someone who doesn't know Christ.
- 17. Take 60 seconds and pray for that person you haven't seen in church for a while.
- 18. Take 60 seconds to thank God that you have access to a Bible in your own language.
- 19. Take 60 seconds and pray for those awaiting the Bible in their own language.
- 20. Take 60 seconds and pray for that politician you don't like.
- 21. Take 60 seconds and pray for that person at church you don't like (or doesn't like you).
- 22. Take 60 seconds and pray for more of the Fruit of the Spirit in you (Gal. 5:22-23).
- 23. Take 60 seconds and ask the Lord of the harvest to send out workers (Matt. 9:38).
- 24. Take 60 seconds and pray, "Come, Lord Jesus!" (Rev. 22:20).

That should do it.
