

## Monthly Prayer Letter - October, 2025

Dear Church Family,

### How does one pray for a church business meeting?

Most likely, at our October 26<sup>th</sup> Quarterly Congregational Meeting, we will open our time with a word of prayer, and we'll adjourn the meeting in prayer. Perhaps we will ask the Lord to bless our meeting (and secretly, we may pray that the meeting might not run too long into the afternoon). We may pray that we would conduct our business together in a manner worthy of our calling as deeply devoted followers of Jesus, and that God would be glorified as the agenda unfolds. Even at our all-church potluck that will precede our meeting, I imagine we will give thanks for the food and for the hands that prepared each dish shared.

In addition to these prayers, I invite you to join me in praying along these lines as we anticipate gathering together for our business meeting this Sunday.

#### Praise God for the past twelve months of ministry together.

I know. We typically don't reflect on the past year until our January meeting. In three months, we will. But I can't help but think back to last October and our church's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration. Not only did we celebrate 100 years of the Lord's faithfulness, but together we looked forward in anticipation to what He would do in the months and years to come. One year later, here we are.

Take a minute and think through all that the Lord has done in our midst these past twelve months. As you put together your mental list, praise Him for His abundant goodness to us as a church. We are to "give thanks in all circumstances" (1 Th. 5:18), so let's give thanks to God for the things we are rejoicing about together, and for His faithfulness through the unexpected challenges and trials we faced together as a church. To God be the glory for 101 years (and counting) of ministry!

#### Pray for a ministry budget that promotes discipleship.

If you're not a numbers person, your eyes might glaze over looking at the proposed 2026 Ministry Budget. I thank God for the men and women who have invested hours into shaping a budget proposal for us to consider and vote on at our meeting.

trusts the Sovereign Lord to "meet all-[our] needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus" (Php. 4:19).

#### Pray for our church's ministry leaders.

We held a class recently for folks interested in becoming members at our church. One of the topics we cover in the class is how our church governs itself. We talk about things like what it means to belong to the EFCA, but still function as an autonomous local church. We discuss what it means to be congregationally led, and the role our church officers (elders, trustees, etc.) play as leaders.

Traditionally, we elect new officers for leadership roles at our October business meeting. Whether or not you cast a vote at Sunday's business meeting, would you commit to praying regularly for our church's ministry leaders?

Thank you for praying for our pastors and staff (we truly appreciate it). You have know idea what an encouragement it is when someone takes the time to say, "I am praying for you." Pray as well for our elders, that they would shepherd the flock well. Pray for our Trustees as they navigate things like budgets, roof repairs, insurance claims, and other facility and finance concerns.

But don't stop there. Thank God for our Nominating Committee members. Give thanks for those who serve in roles like our Financial Secretary, Treasurer, Church Clerk, and Global Connections Chair. Pray for our women's and men's ministry leaders, our worship leaders, for Life Group leaders, for kids and youth ministry leaders, those leading search committees, leaders who serve on Wednesdays and Sundays (as well as Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays), for leaders serving up front and those serving behind the scenes, for leaders who have a ministry title and those who step in an lead as needed. You get the idea. Please pray for our ministry leaders, however you define the term "ministry leader."

#### More than a meeting.

Business meetings are necessary. But business meetings can also be an opportunity for discipleship. They can prompt us to pray. We can pray through the meeting agenda. We can pray for those who have a role in the meeting. We can pray for the names on a ballot. We can look around the room at who is in attendance and pray for one another. Join me in not only praying for our Congregational Meeting on Sunday, but also for all the ministry a meeting like this represents. See you Sunday!
