


Questions

1. What comes to mind when you think of the phrase "the last days"? When did the last days begin? What does the New Testament mean by "the day of the Lord" (cf. Acts 2:20; 1 Cor 5:4-5; 1 Thess 5:2)
2. Read Matthew 24:9-14. What did Jesus warn about concerning the last days? Why is that a serious warning for all who profess faith in Jesus Christ?
3. What do Acts 16:6-10 & Acts 17:1-9 teach about the birth of the church in Thessalonica (the capital of the province of Macedonia)? What might have been some of Paul's concerns for the Thessalonian believers?
4. Read 1 Thessalonians 1:6 & 3:2-4 and 1 Peter 2:20-21 & 4:12-13. Summarize the teaching about believers and suffering.
5. When things go wrong, or when you are suffering or dealing with injustice, how is your faith in God tempted? What questions are you likely to ask?
6. When things go wrong, or when you are suffering or dealing with injustice, how is your love for others tested (keeping in mind that biblical love is active sacrifice)?
7. When things go wrong, or when you are suffering or dealing with injustice, how is your spiritual and emotional endurance tempted?
