2. Read Romans 9:3; Ephesians 2:12; and Romans 5:8-11. What kind of a relationship does a person have with God, if that person is not trusting in Jesus Christ as Savior?
3. Read Romans 10:2-3. How would you describe God's righteousness, and why it's important, to someone who doesn't understand what that means?
4. According to Romans 10:9, what is required for a sinner to be saved? What is the relation of Christ's resurrection to His death?
5. What are some of the claims that Jesus made about Himself that support the requirement of confessing Him as Lord.?
