Why??

Many years ago there was an experiment done in San Francisco,

wondering if "knowing why" made a difference. Here's how the experiment worked many years ago.

One Monday, a group of 40 guys were hired at \$10 an hour to dig a ditch, and then just before lunch they were given the assignment to come back after lunch and fill the ditch back in. At the end of the day, they were all invited back the next day and were told their job would be the same the next day but that they would get \$20 an hour for the same task.

On Tuesday, only some of the guys showed back up, and sure enough their task was the same and the pay was doubled. Some quit part way through the day.

On Wednesday, the pay was doubled again, but even less guys showed up to work.

On Thursday, the pay was doubled one more time, but even less guys showed up to do the same job.

On Friday, the pay was doubled one more time, but only one guy showed up to do the repetitive and mean-

ingless work for \$160 per hour.

There was no value to what they were doing, because they didn't know why they were digging holes and filling them in.

In contrast, about two months later, another experiment was made. A new set of 50 guys were hired and paid \$10 an hour to dig out an area where a new hospital was going to be built. Those guys worked for 8 weeks at \$10 per hour and enjoyed what they did. They had a reason to work, and they knew why they were working, and they did good work for a whole lot less pay.

Knowing our why is important. The Scriptures are pretty clear about why churches exist. First of all, the church exists to WORSHIP and celebrate the goodness of God. At the same time, the church exists to be the BRIDE OF JESUS CHRIST and fellowship with one another, learn from one another, encourage, support and pray for another, as well as meet the needs of one another. This includes helping each other grow in knowledge and faith. The church also exists to SHARE the love of Jesus with those who don't know Him, make disciples of Jesus Christ

and train them to be followers of Jesus (this is called outreach, evangelism and missions). **The church also exists** to DO GOOD WORKS and demonstrate the goodness of God.

These are the reasons Lincoln exists, and we are excited that our church family rallies around and supports these whys. We are not just setting up chairs, we are praying for connection with God and connection with one other. We are not just shopping for food, we are praying that the children would hear about God and respond to His love. We are not just standing near the sound board, we are helping people hear the Word of God, and sing praises to His name. We are not just passing out bulletins, we are genuinely welcoming people to church, sending a message of God's love and God's presence to each person who arrives.



Financial Report

At the end of April the operating fund was \$31,849 in the black, coming back from the March report of \$1,947. We are on track with both income and expenditures. The Building loan ended April at \$121,424. The reserves of \$46,574 reduce the amount we owe to \$75,850. Isn't that amazing? Your continued faithfulness to God's work is a blessing to all.

Although the May net is in the negative, the year to date shows that we are on track.

The Building Fund received \$30,282 in May, and we were able to pay the mortgage payment of \$6,943 and an excess of \$23,339 toward our principal. The balance on the loan is \$91,712 and we have reserves of \$46,574 which would reduce the amount we owe to \$45,139. Thank you for your continued commitment and support of LPC through your giving, time, and talents.

LPC received a check from JP Morgan-Chase for \$1,000 in May. There was no indication who it was from and where it should be directed. We called JP Morgan-Chase and they could not give us any additional information. We deposited to Tithes and Offerings as Anonymous. If it was yours, please contact the church office with correct information. Just a reminder to everyone, if you're having a check sent from an institution make sure there's information about who it's from and where it's to go along with the check. Thank you.

DETAILS FROM THE 2023 NOMINATING COMMITTEE

The LPC 2023 Nominating Committee seeks your input in the process of selecting candidates for the office of Deacon (6 people) and Elder (4 people) for the Class of 2025 and 2026 respectively. When you submit names, the Nominating Committee will consider those people along with all names submitted. The candidates selected by the Nominating Committee, after much discussion and prayer, will be presented to the Congregation for election. The elections are held at a Congregational Meeting in the fall. Nominations may be given to the Committee by using the form to the right. Forms should be given to the church office (sealed in envelope) or to one of the Nominating Committee members as listed on the bottom of the form. These forms need to be returned to the Committee by July 24, 2023. You may put it in the offering boxes, mail or drop it by the church office.

Elders, together with the pastors, lead and direct the ministry of the church. They are persons of faith, dedication and good judgment. Elders serve on Session, the governing body of the church. They also chair various church teams through which all ministries are conducted. Twelve elders are ordained to serve a three-year term.

Deacons, as set forth in scripture, are leaders who serve as the caring, compassionate arm of the church, providing loving support to all those in need within the church community. The primary area of service is the care of members. Ten to eighteen deacons are ordained to serve a two-year term.

The Trustee position has been filled by a Trustee who is willing to serve a consecutive term.


