As a church, one of our great priorities is "to know and love God," which basical-

ly is a shortened version of the greatest commandment Jesus gave, "to love the Lord with all your heart, and all your soul, and all your mind." Recently, I have been thinking about how I love God and how I express my love for God in daily decisions and in my life priorities. Approximately a month ago, I met someone and was reminded about a financial faith journey that Bev and I have been committed to living by. I will call it - "honoring God in our financial investing."

Many years ago, my wife and I financially invested in something with a theme "Double Dividend". The first part of the dividend was the desire to invest for retirement and see our dollar values increase. The extra dividend (hence double dividend) was the idea that our dollars were being

used to loan money to church plants and church expansions - and since we believed (and still do) that church planting was an important and strong biblical principle - this is something we wanted to participate in.

Recently I had a chance to get reacquainted with something similar, a term called "faith based investing". This deals with the heart of how our investment dollars are being used, and what values and entities are being supported in an effort to see a financial increase take place for us. This involves thinking about what things are making money using our investment. Let me explain.

It is about two things - one is avoiding having money invested in companies who have portfolios with money going toward actions that go against my faith based values such as: pornography, abortion, and other attacks on unhealthy lifestyles.

The second is about having money invested in companies who have portfolios going toward actions that support my faith based values. These might include having investments like I explained earlier.

Many years ago, our leaders at Lincoln chose a wonderful organization who carefully asks its I nvestors what priorities they have in their financial journey.

Thank you Lincoln leaders for having a heart and a set of actions that chooses to do their best in honoring the greatest commandment from Jesus, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul and all your mind."

December/January Financial Report



At the end of December the operating fund was \$125,730 in the black. During the closing of the 2022 books, we were able to pay an additional 151,683 toward our CIF mortgage, leaving a balance of \$202,335. We were also able to transfer excess funds to the Major Maintenance Fund leaving a balance of \$40,000 and to the Kitchen Fund, leaving a balance of \$40,000. We

also transferred \$14,000 to the Missionary Support – LPC Fund. Your continued faithfulness to God's work is a blessing to all.

In January, the Operating Fund ended \$16,432 in the black and we are on track for a good year.

The Building Fund received \$8,452 in January, and we were able to pay the mortgage payment of \$6,943 and an excess of \$1,509 toward our principal. The balance on the loan is \$195,523 and we have reserves of \$46,420 which could be applied to the balance. Thank you for your continued commitment and support of LPC through your giving, time, and talents.


