Discussion Questions

Knowing

1. The context of this passage is the Upper Room Discourse to his 12 apostles (chapters 13-17). How does that context help us better understand what Jesus intended for us, his later “disciples” (see 17:20) and what he intended uniquely for those “apostles” (see 17:6 and 12)?

2. How does knowing v. 33 help us amid our tribulations in this world, and what is one other example of how KNOWING helps us in our daily living (i.e., how is revelation valuable for us)?

Being

1. What are two aspects of “the fruit of the Spirit” (Galatians 5:22-23) that Jesus expects to characterize our being, and how evident are they in your life right now?

2. Is being “filled with sorrow” (v. 6) good, bad, or “it depends”? If “it depends,” on what does it depend to make it good?

Doing

1. What verse or section in this chapter most impresses you today, and what does it lead you to do?

2. What does that verse or section move you to pray for yourself and/or others?
