“Dead to Sin, Alive to God: The Freedom of Union with Christ”

Romans 6:1-14

HEAR the Word

“Open my eyes, that I might behold wondrous things out of your law.”

-Psalm 119:18

1. What does Paul mean in verse 2 when he says “we who died to sin”? Is this a future hope or a past reality?
2. Verse 6 speaks of “our old self” being “crucified with Him.” What exactly was crucified, and what power was broken?

PRACTICE the Word

“...Everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock.”

-Matthew 7:24

1. Verse 11 commands us to reckon two truths about ourselves. How does daily “counting” these truths change the way you fight temptation this week?
2. Verse 14 says we are “not under law but under grace.” How does this truth free you from both legalism and license?

RETELL the Word

“Go home to your own people and tell them how much the Lord has done for you...”

-Mark 5:19

1. If you had a brother in Christ wrestling with guilt or habitual sin right now? Which verse or phrase from 6:1–14 would you encourage him with today, and why?
2. Think of one non-Christian friend or co-worker who believes “I’m a good person” or “God grades on a curve.” How would you use the picture of co-crucifixion (v. 6) or new resurrection life (v. 4) to share the gospel with him this month?
