



Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions—Valery and Janna Morozov: Valery and Janna Morozov have served as key leaders with Wycliffe Bible Translators in Russia for nearly 25 years. Their work includes training new missionaries, supporting workers as they transition into field assignments, and offering ongoing spiritual guidance and prayer to teams across the region. Valery, an ordained pastor, also leads weekly Bible studies in their home, creating a place of encouragement and discipleship. Recently, Valery and Janna shared their deep appreciation for the prayers, care, and support they've received. They reflected, "Though not everything is good, God can use all things to glorify Himself, as He has done in our lives." Please join them in prayer for a U.S. Visa to visit their youngest daughter and son-in-law, whom they have not met, and to visit supporting churches in the States.

Mission Memphis—Adult and Teen Challenge of Memphis: For over 50 years, Adult and Teen Challenge of Memphis has been on the front lines as a faith-based cure for the addiction epidemic, providing a Christ-centered residential and reentry program for adult men (18+) struggling with addictions. The program utilizes Bible-based curriculum to develop men spiritually, while also helping them gain the necessary life skills to aid them in the practical side of their recovery. Far more than stopping at treatment, ATCM helps men work to the root of the issue and depend on the Holy Spirit for true transformation. Please pray for the staff, that they would have strength in their service. Pray for the students, that the Lord would give them endurance and motivation to grow. Finally, pray for the graduates, that the Lord would strengthen and keep their faith as they walk with Christ.

2PC Ministry—Sports and Recreation: The mission of our Sports and Recreation Ministry is to glorify God and build His church by using sports, fitness, and recreation to foster fellowship, evangelism, and service to the city.
