# God's Plan for Salvation-All Glory to Him Alone

## Romans 11

### I. God's Plan of Salvation, 11:1-32

#### A. God's Chosen Remnant, vs. 1-10

#### B. God's Ingrafted Branches, vs. 11-24

#### C. God's Sovereign Mystery and Mercy, vs. 25-32

### II. God Alone Is To Be Praised, 11:33-36

**Main Truth: God is sovereignly and graciously at work accomplishing His salvation plan for the Jews and the Gentiles.**

**Aim: Paul aims to encourage his readers to trust God to fulfill His plans for salvation and to respond in humble, heartfelt adoration for who He is.**

## Truths about God:

- 1) God always faithfully preserves a remnant of believers—then and now.
  - 2) God has a purpose in everything He does.
  - 3) God shows mercy to all—Jews and Gentiles.
- 4) God's wealth, wisdom, knowledge, and ways are infinitely higher than our's. He is absolutely superior in all ways.
  - 5) God does not need our help.
  - 6) God alone deserves all the glory.

Response: Humility (Job 38-40), Trust, Take Refuge, Praise

## "All Israel", 11:26

### 3 Theologically Possible Interpretations:

- 1) Every elect ethnic Jew (remnant)
- 2) A large number of ethnic Jews at the end of the age
- 3) The church as spiritual Israel (every elect Jew and Gentiles)
