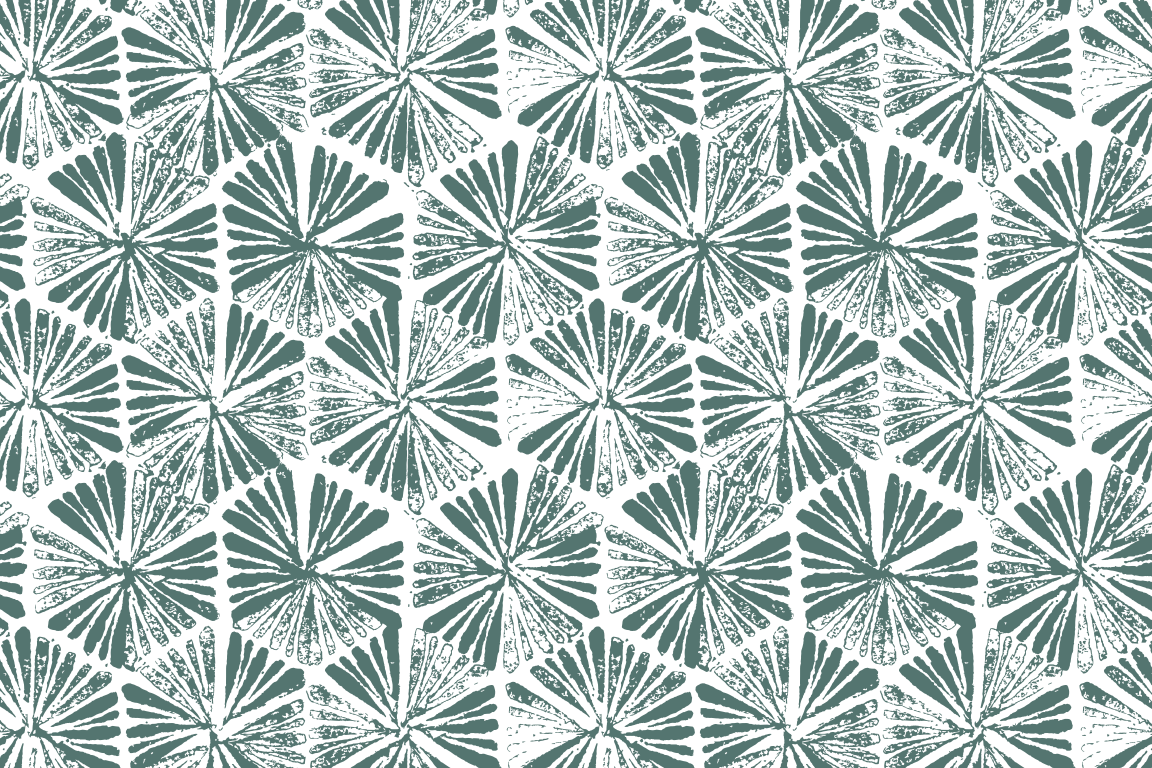
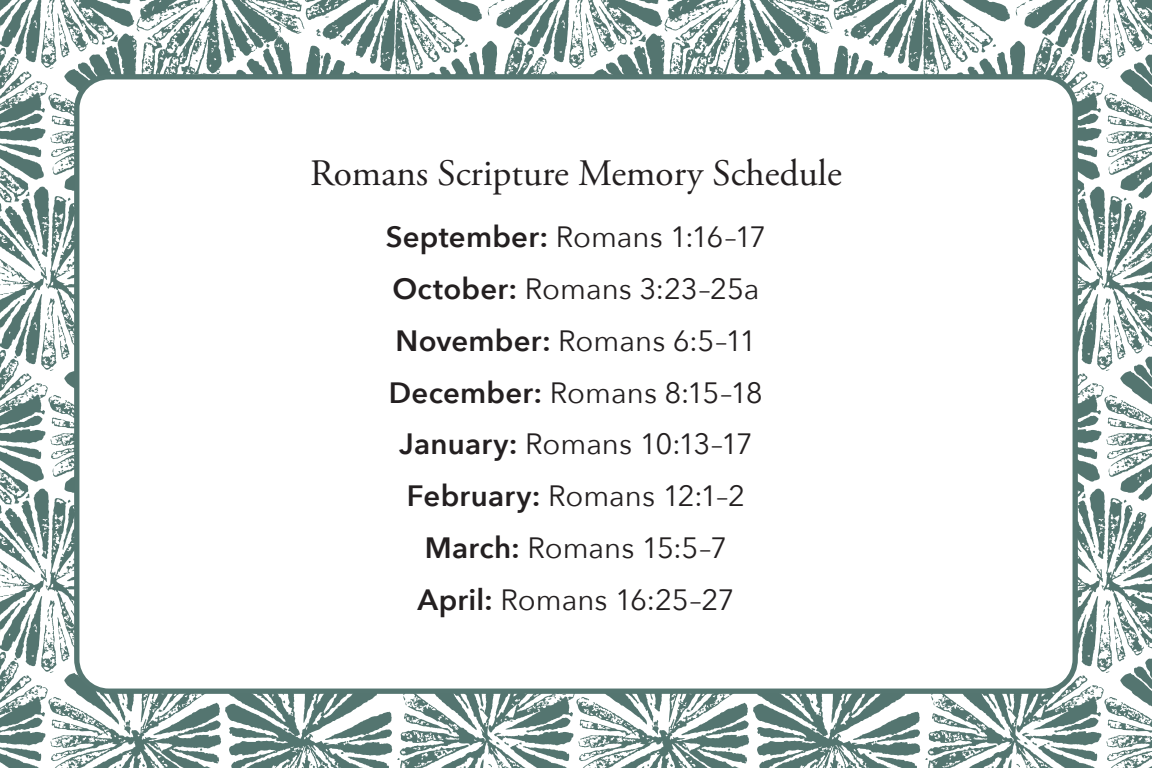

November: Romans 6:5-11

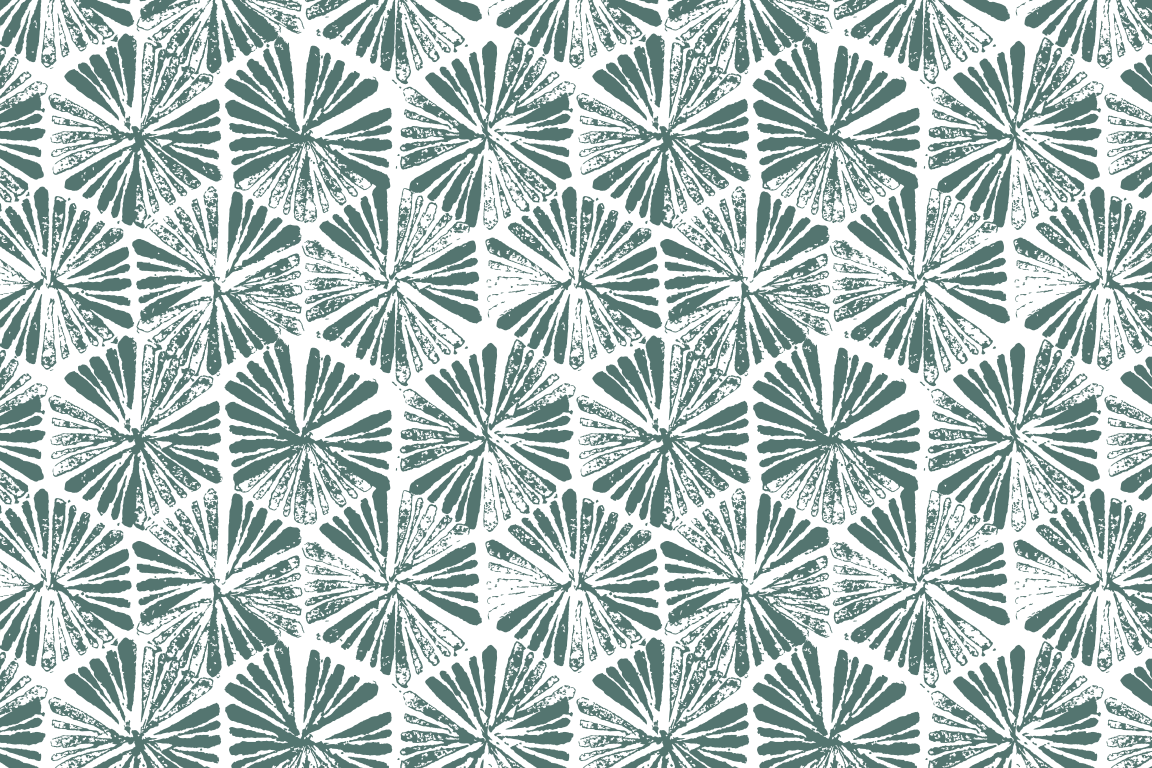
December: Romans 8:15-18

April: Romans 16:25-27



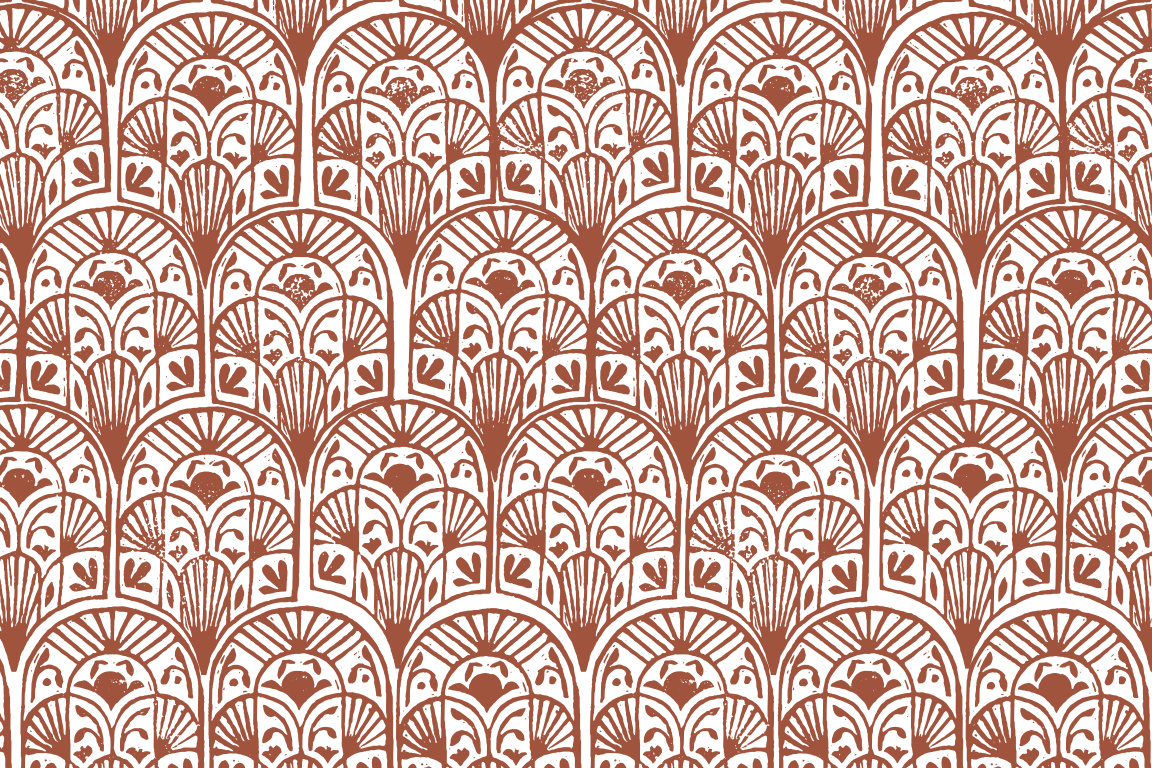
Scripture Memory Tips

PRAY: Ask the Lord to help you hide His Word in your heart.

PLAN: Create a specific weekly plan for when and how you will memorize scripture.

PRACTICE: Read the passage often. Keep scripture cards where you'll see them—like in your car, on your mirror, desk, or in your bag. Say the verses out loud. Listen to them set to music or record yourself reading them to play back.

PARTNER: Find a buddy to memorize with and say the verse to each other every week—audio messages work great if you're busy!

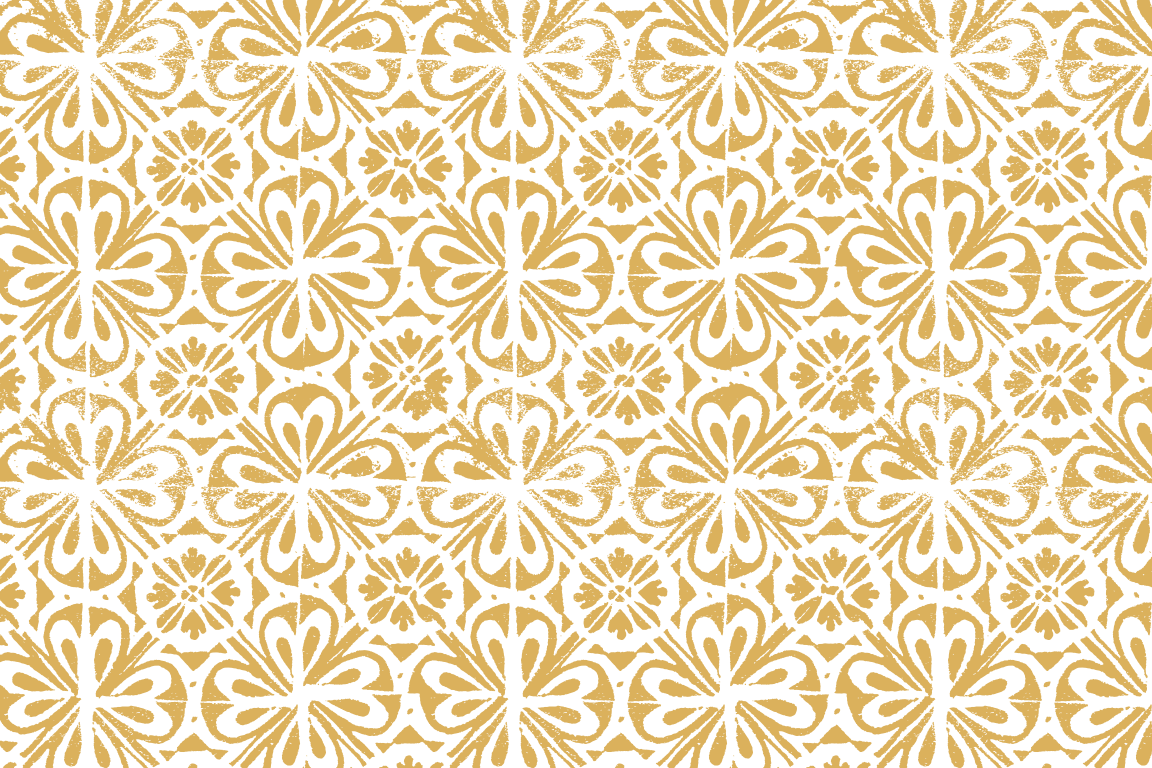


Romans 1:16–17

Boasting in the Gospel

¹⁶For I am not ashamed of the gospel,
for it is the power of God for salvation
to everyone who believes,
to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

¹⁷For in it the righteousness of God is revealed
from faith for faith, as it is written,
“The righteous shall live by faith.”



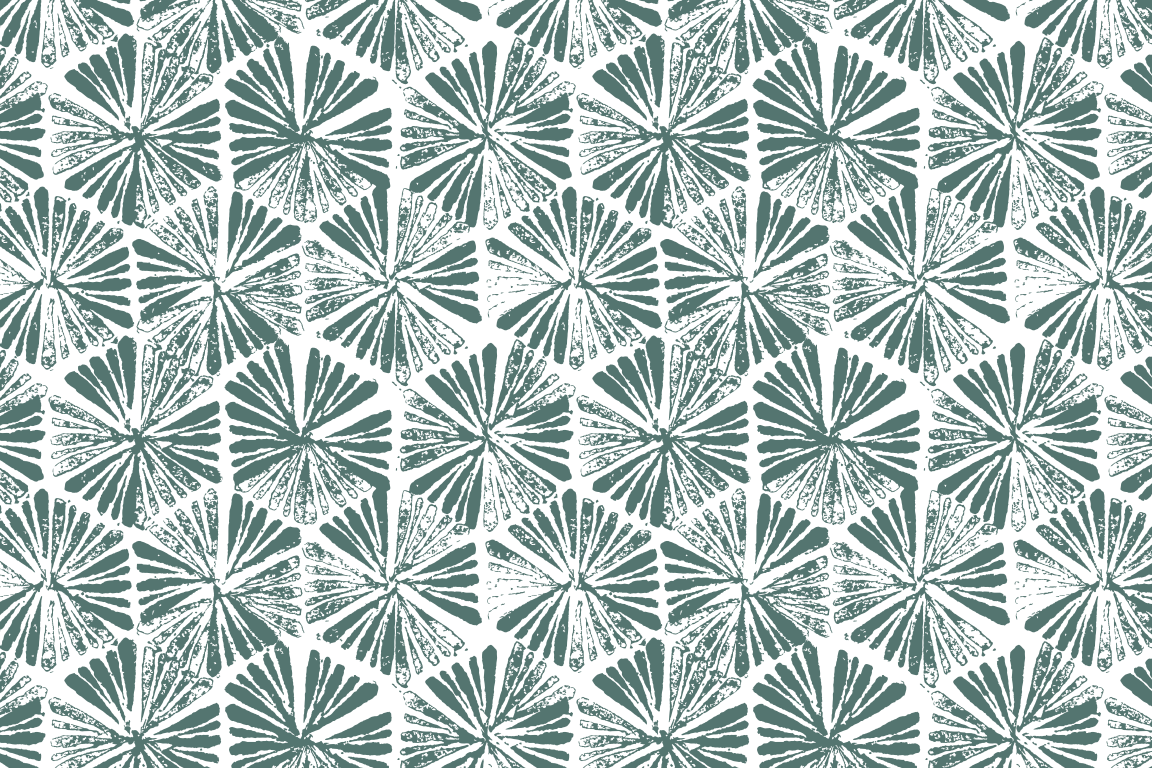
Romans 3:23–25a

Receiving Christ's Righteousness as a Gift

²³For all have sinned
and fall short of the glory of God,

²⁴and are justified by his grace as a gift,
through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus,

²⁵whom God put forward
as a propitiation by his blood,
to be received by faith.



Romans 6:5–11

Considering Yourself Dead to Sin and Alive to God in Christ

⁵For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

⁶We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin.

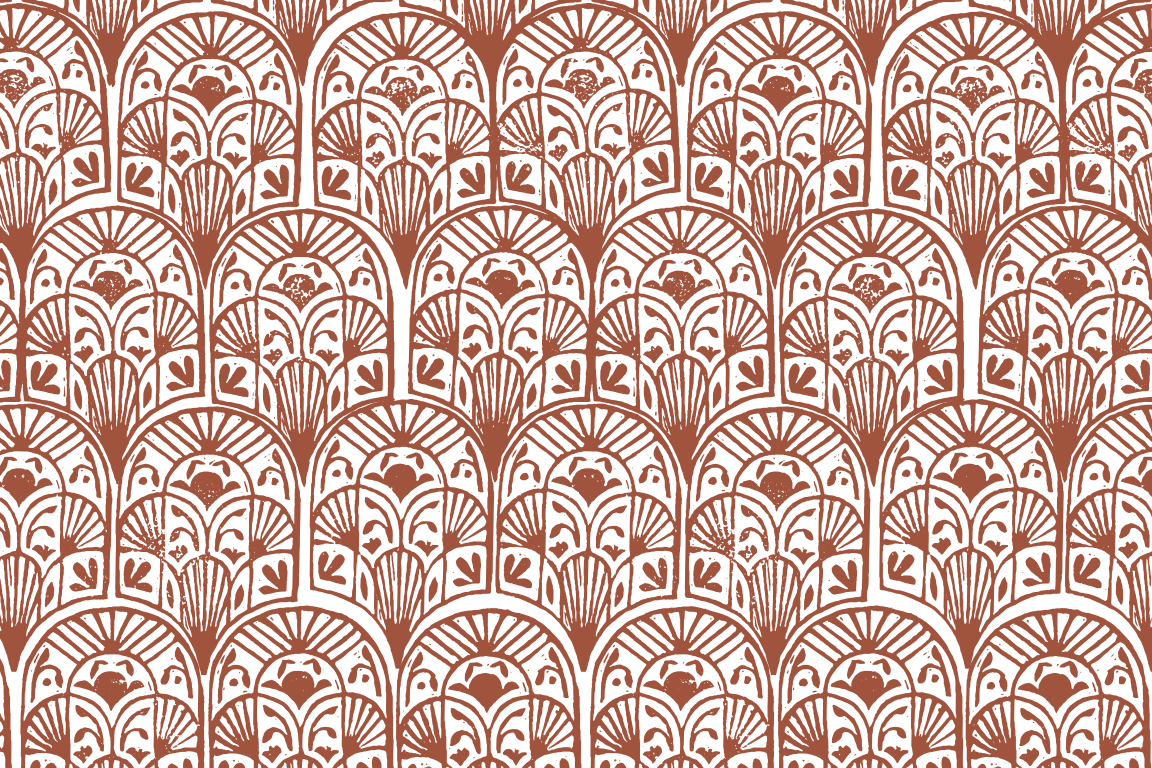
⁷For one who has died has been set free from sin.

⁸Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him.

⁹We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him.

¹⁰For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God.

¹¹So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.



Romans 8:15–18

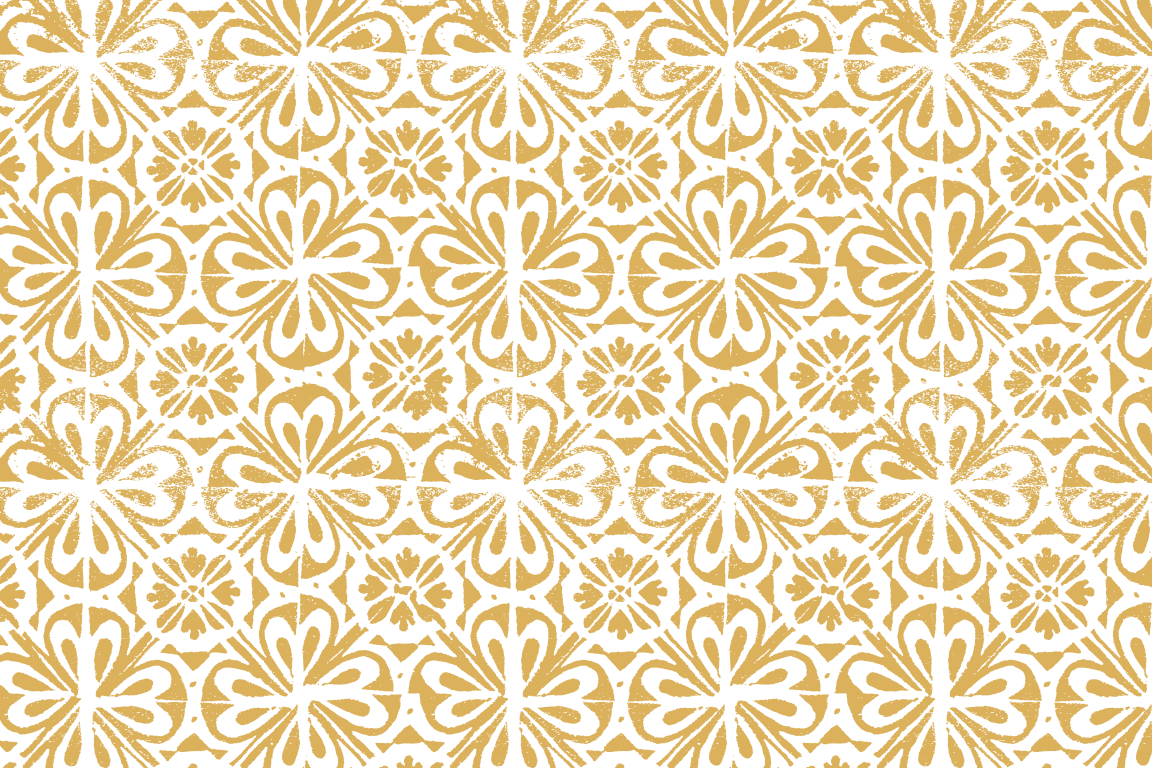
Living by God's Spirit

¹⁵For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!"

¹⁶The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God,

¹⁷and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

¹⁸For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us.

Preaching the Good News to the World

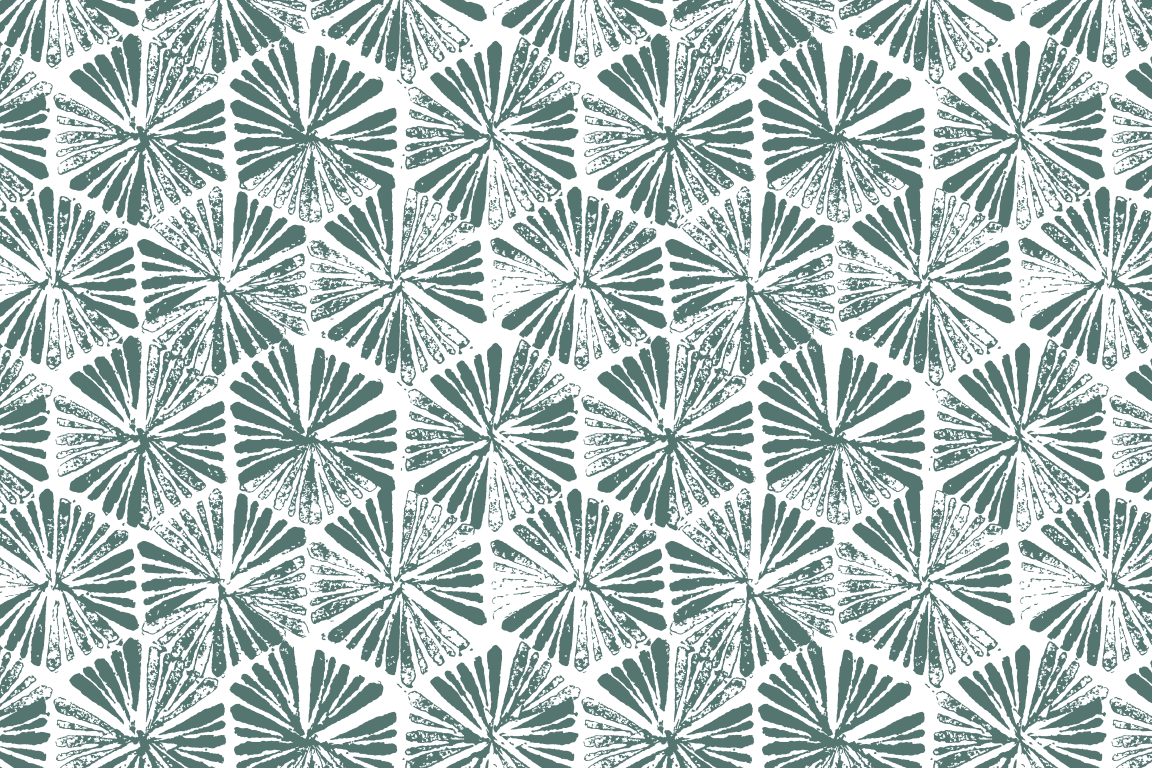
¹³For “everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”

¹⁴How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed?
And how are they to believe in him whom they have never heard?
And how are they to hear without someone preaching?

¹⁵And how are they to preach unless they are sent?
As it is written, “How beautiful are the feet
of those who preach the good news!”

¹⁶But they have not all obeyed the gospel.
For Isaiah says, “Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?”

¹⁷So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

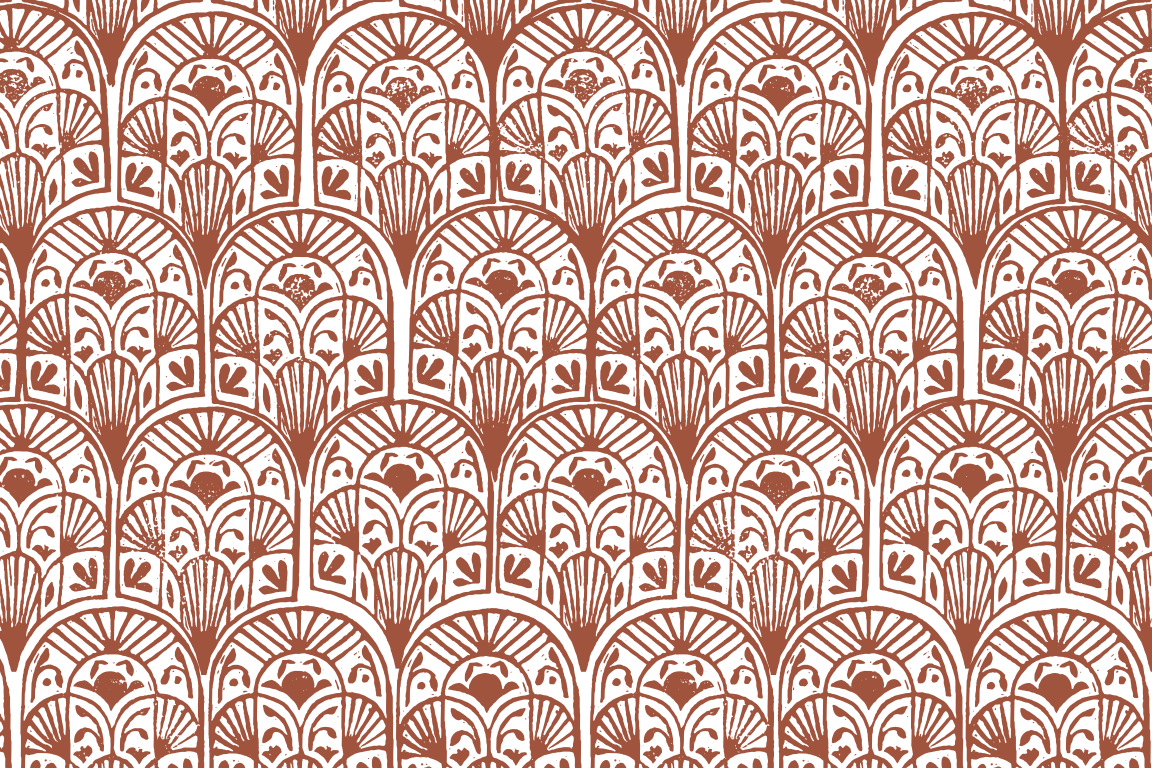


Romans 12:1–2

¹I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters,

to present your bodies as a living sacrifice,
holy and acceptable to God,
which is your spiritual worship.

²Do not be conformed to this world,

that by testing you may discern what is the will of God,
what is good and acceptable and perfect.



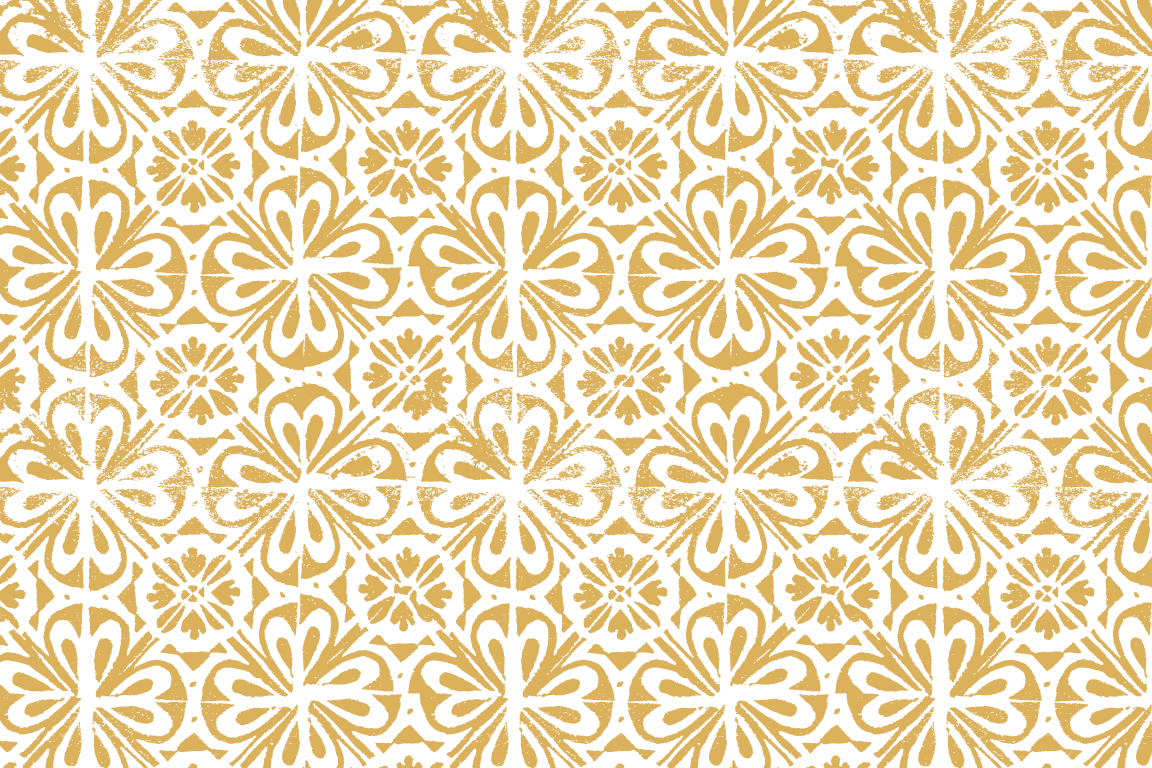
Romans 15:5–7

⁷Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.



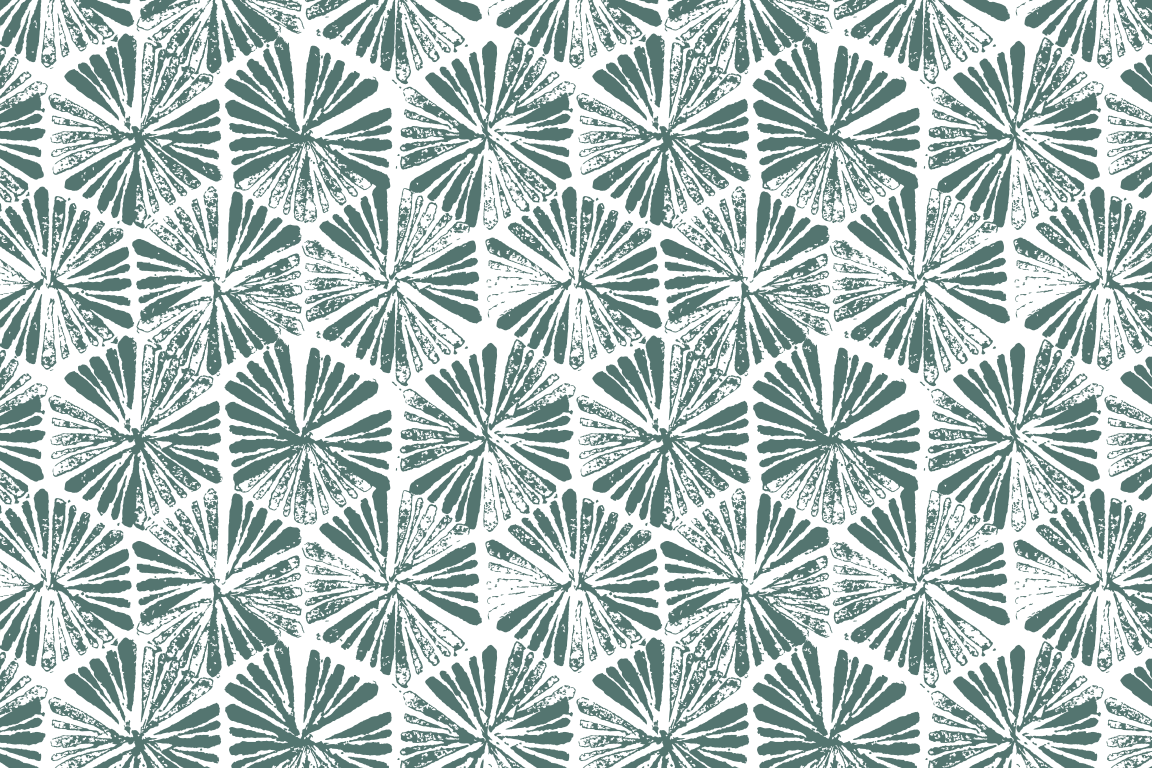
Romans 16:25–27

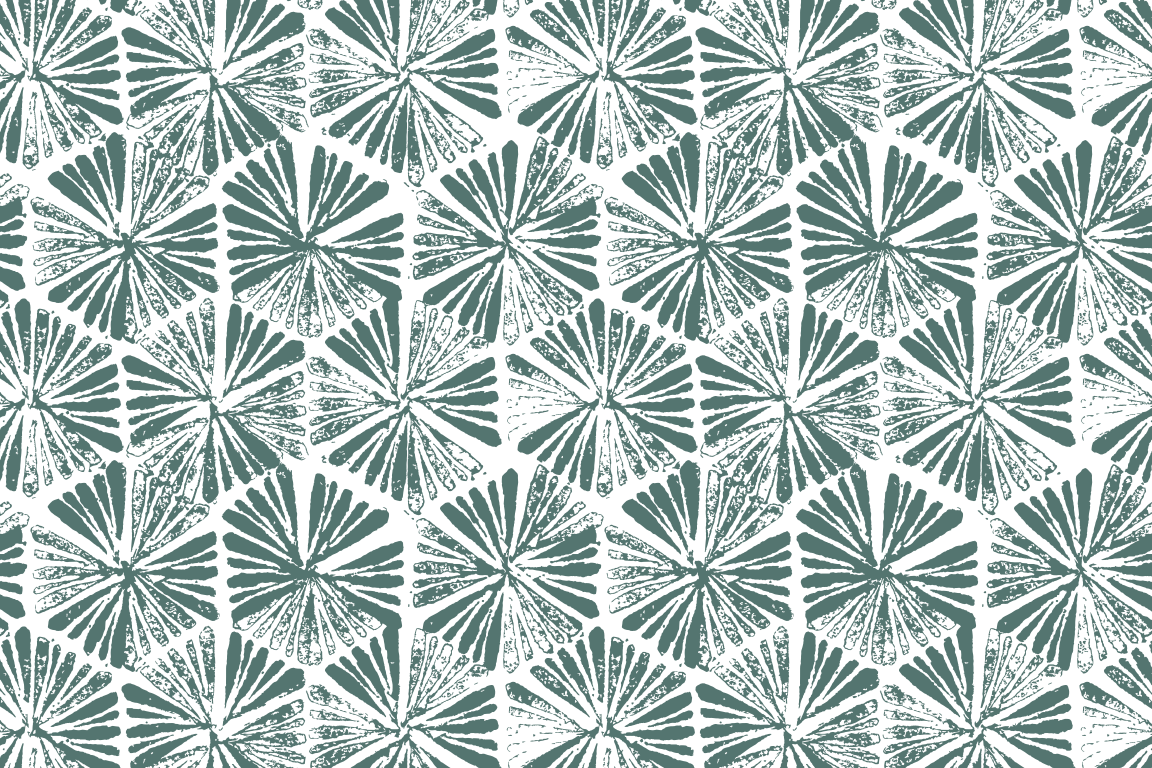
Glorying in the God of the Gospel
