TRINITY YOUTH INTERNSHIP INITIATIVE

The Restorative Justice Committee has had, as one focus, the plight of juveniles in our city. We have continued to look for ways to enrich the lives of underserved youth in our area.

One dream of our committee has been to create internships for these youth within the businesses of Trinity Church.

We are pleased that this summer we are rolling out a pilot run of this effort. Perlis Co., Auto-Chlor, Christovich & Kearney Law Firm, Baker Donelson Law Firm, and possibly Entergy have answered our call. We are presently partnering with YEP (Youth Empowerment Program) to recruit and train candidates for these internships.

We are working out many details but feel encouraged that this dream ministry of Trinity Church will become a reality this summer.

We will be reviewing this opportunity for young people, and it is our hope that the program will expand in the future to include many more businesses and internships. The goal is to broaden our young people's horizons and expose them to new career possibilities.

Safe Church



GENESIS 1:1--2:4A

A Reading from the book of Genesis.

¹In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, ²the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. ³Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. ⁴And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And it was so. ¹⁶God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. ¹⁷God set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth, ¹⁸to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. ¹⁹And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.

²⁵God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good.

²⁶Then God said, "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth."
