The People sit.

Then he said, "Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak just once more. Suppose ten are found there." He answered, "For the sake of ten I will not destroy it."

For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses, erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. He set this aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and made a public example of them, triumphing over them in it.

Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!”

Silent Retreat led by Paula D’Arcy (October 23-26) Paula D’Arcy is a retreat leader, speaker, and the author of 12 books, including *Gift of the Red Bird*, *Waking Up to This Day*, *Stars at Night* and *Winter of the Heart*. In 1975, Paula D’Arcy’s husband and daughter were killed in a drunken driving accident. She was twenty-seven years old and three months pregnant, yet survived. Six months later, she gave birth to her second daughter, Beth, and began the long process of healing. Since then, she has authored many books, worked as a therapist in private practice, and established a retreat and speaking ministry. Paula’s ministry is to serve the very movement of love that changed her own destiny. Her guiding focus is embedded in an intention to assist others in the opening of the heart and awakening to a greater love.

The retreat will begin on Thursday evening with dinner at 6:30pm on Thursday, October 23 and will end with lunch at noon on Sunday, October 26. Please arrive no earlier than 5:00pm on Thursday. This retreat is a silent retreat. Paula will lead talks at various times, and the remainder of the time participants will be in silence.
