Lodging will be at Hotel Ambato. This is a modern hotel with standard amenities.

Flights will be round trip direct from Houston's George Bush ITC to Quito, EC.



Language is Spanish. Translators will be provided.

Limitations:

- All team members must be at least 12 years old.
- While some accommodations can be made, there is a need for at least a moderate level of physical mobility.

Health & Security:

- Vaccinations are not required – ask your doctor.
- While there are minimal security risks, the team will operate with caution and wisdom as is necessary in any major city or international destination.

Sign-Up & Deadlines:

- Registration and Deposit of \$100 is due April 1st.
- Copy of passport must be submitted by April 15th.
- 100% of trip cost is due June 10th.
