



## From Waiting to Worshiping

Habakkuk 3

### Read Habakkuk 3 Together. Focus on Verses 17-19:

*<sup>17</sup> Though the fig tree should not blossom, nor fruit be on the vines, the produce of the olive fail and the fields yield no food, the flock be cut off from the fold and there be no herd in the stalls, <sup>18</sup> yet I will rejoice in the LORD; I will take joy in the God of my salvation. <sup>19</sup> GOD, the Lord, is my strength; he makes my feet like the deer's; he makes me tread on my high places . . .*

- ? Let's review our study of the book of Habakkuk. What is the context of this book? What is the complaint of Habakkuk? How does God answer his complaint?
- ? This week's passage marks a noticeable change in Habakkuk. What change do you see?

### Worship Starts with Setting Our Eyes on God Instead of the Problem.

- ? It is often said that, in our world today, we lean toward a negativity bias. We obsess over the negative. Would you agree? Do you see a negativity bias in your own life?
- ? From Chapter 2 to Chapter 3, Habakkuk goes from complaining and confusion to peace and worship. What do you think prompted this change?
- ? Read Habakkuk 2:20. In this verse, we receive an invitation to fix our eyes on God and see him as he is. How should we see God? How can seeing God in this way encourage you in your current circumstances?

### When it Seems Like We Have Nothing, God is More Than Enough.

- ? Chapter 3 of Habakkuk focuses on the virtues of God. What virtues of God do you see in this passage?
- ? In what areas of your life do you feel something is lacking? What are some of your worst fears?
- ? Read Habakkuk 3:17-19 again. How do these verses encourage you that God is more than enough, no matter your situation?

### Application:

- ? How can you take a step this week to rejoice in your Savior, not your situation?
- ? What are you currently building your life on? What are you placing your identity in? How can you place your identity and foundation fully on Christ?
- ? Following Christ is not about avoiding a list of sins you find enjoyable. It's an invitation to experience the wonder, power, and glory of Jesus. What is one way that you can experience the wonder of Christ this week?
