Audio Visual Tech Help – Provide technical assistance for a Sunday service, morning, or night, with Sound board, Video, Lighting, or Song Show Plus operator.

A Soldier's Hands - Send care packages to service men & women who are deployed to defend our freedom. A personal thank you note is included in each package. Sponsor a packing event or just write thank you notes since they are always needed. A wonderful way for kids to get involved.

Advent Night - Help with various mission projects on a festive Sunday night in December as we await the birth of Jesus. Volunteers are always needed to lead the various activities and help serve dinner.

Adopt-A-Highway - Join a work crew to pick up debris along Lower Makefield Township roads.

Angel Tree - Provide a Christmas gift to a child in need and/or help set up the tree in early November.

Blood Drive – Donate blood at one of our many blood drives at Woodside Church.

Bucks County Housing Group, Penn del Food Pantry (Steve Keller) - Be a pantry volunteer at the Penn del Food Pantry or sign up to drop off donations provided by the Woodside community. Ask how you can help drop off donations.

Caring Ministry - R.E.A.C.H - (Kay Brown) Lifting up those who are hurting, grieving, sick and/or in need. Includes home visits, hospital visits, prayers, and/or phone calls.

Children's Ministries: (Stephanie Hermesmeyer) So many ways to serve our youth at Woodside, from Sunday School to Adventure Club to VBS to Operation Christmas Child, you are needed.

Cast Your Cares - (John & Helen Hughes, Jim Stevens) Carpool and serve a meal to the homeless throughout the year in Kensington.

Church Facility Projects - (Bruce Jones) ask about the many ways you can volunteer your time and talents to make Woodside's building a beautiful and welcoming place to Worship and gather.

Church Office Help - (Caroline McIntyre) Perform general office duties such as answering the phone, collecting, and distributing mail, receiving deliveries, stuffing weekly bulletins, directing inquiries.

Code Blue - (Hilary Walp) - Serve our Lower Bucks homeless guests by being a host and/or helping serve a meal at Woodside Church on all extremely chilly nights during the month of January.

Congregation Wide Service Projects - whether it is Church Has Left the Building activities, seed/meal packing or building homes for Habitat in the church parking lot, we need you to help coordinate. Reach out if you would like to help or lead a project.

Dinner Ministry - Woodside provides a meal for the homeless and those in need in Bucks County on the 2nd Monday of every month. Come help host or prepare/serve the meal. No specific skills needed.

English as a Second Language (Judy McCann) - GROW ESL is a Christian based organization who helps immigrants learn English. Once a month, they offer a Conversation Cafe where volunteers come in for an hour, and the learners have an opportunity to practice their English skills. Grow ESL provides conversation prompts and refreshments. When else would you get to discuss favorite recipes with women from Tajikistan or Uzbekistan, or learn how they celebrate Christmas in Ukraine? This takes place at the Cafe for the Bustleton site (Seven Mile Road Church 525 Welsh Road, Philadelphia).

Father Davids Mentoring and Reentry Program (Tom Spacek) - Become a mentor and help ex-offenders make a successful transition from prison back to communities and families. All you need is a good heart and willingness to help others. Training will be provided.

Habitat for Humanity (Craig Bryson) - Be a part of the team to help build or rehab houses and/or volunteer at Restore, Habitat's retail store in Langhorne. No experience needed.

Interfaith Food Alliance/Family Backpack Center (Diane Coyle) - Provides a supplemental food source for children and their families in the Morrisville School District who have been identified as food insecure. Be a pantry volunteer or sign up to drop off donations provided by the Woodside community. Ask how you can help drop off donations.

Mission Trips - Woodside sends teams to the Dominican Republic to work hand in hand with the Foundation for Peace and the local church to create vibrant, sustainable communities. Projects typically consist of construction of classrooms at the elementary school, working on the Community Center, and worship. Time is set aside to play with the local children. No construction experience is necessary. We also send teenagers to the Bahamas and to the Appalachian Service Project.

Nursing Home Worship Service (Scott & Michelle Burgess) – Help by being a part of the worship team (singing, etc.) at Crestview Center in Langhorne, in the second Saturday of each month.

Operation Crop Drop (Gary LaSasso) – Operation Crop Drop was able to donate more than 10,400 pounds of fresh produce to help battle food insecurity in Bucks County in 2025. To make that happen, the farm plot at the Garden of Reflection (at the 9/11 Memorial), needs your help for Spring cleanup, preparing the plot and planting seedlings. Throughout the summer, we need help watering, weeding, harvesting, and delivering produce to the Food Pantry.

Prayer Shawl Group (Jennifer DellaGrotte) – Join us as we gather to crochet or knit prayer shawls that our Deacons can give to others to comfort them. You do not need to know how to crochet or knit to join us. We will teach you.

Prison & Recovery Ministry (Scott & Michelle Burgess):

Recovery Worship Service - Held quarterly at Woodside, this luncheon with a worship service offers support to those in recovery and those who love them. Come help with the meal or the service.

Recovery Café, The Philly Dream Center, Port Richmond - Help serve at the monthly coffee house for individuals and families affected by substance abuse. Held the second Friday of every month, Woodside serves up a Christian band, plus free refreshments in a laid-back atmosphere. All are invited to this free event!

Snipes Farm - (Sheryl Conlow) - Snipes Farm and its community partners deliver 70 percent of the farm's produce to food pantries, senior centers, housing projects, & homeless shelters in Bucks County, Trenton, and beyond. And they can use your help at the farm in Morrisville.

Trenton Area Soup Kitchen (TASK) - (Jim Stevens & Helen Hughes)– Help serve a meal, wrap utensils, assemble breakfast/lunch/dinner bags, make baked goods, entertain clients, or tutor adults. You can also tag along in the new food truck in the Trenton community to serve up meals and hope or help serve a meal at the TASK location in Trenton. There are many volunteer opportunities with this mission.

United Way - Seeking volunteers to help unpack, inspect, and display donations. Other volunteer opportunities are available.

Urban Promise - Provides urban youth and teens with a chance to believe in and build a positive future by providing them with the skills necessary for academic achievement, life management, spiritual growth, and Christian leadership. Let us know if you can help. Also, our children's ministry compiles Easter baskets and summer camp snacks for Urban Promise.

Women's Retreat - (Diana Pabers) Experience teaching, worship, prayer, food, and community in an atmosphere of spiritual growth and connection. All women of high school age and up are welcome. But it takes a lot of preparation and your great ideas to help put the retreats together. We always have a particular mission we support as well.
