

Judith Pritchett Wade was born in Dresden. She began piano lessons at the age of 4, and she began playing the organ at Dresden Methodist Church when she was in 8th grade. She completed her D.M.A. at the University of Memphis in 1996, she and her daughter Lisa studied music at the Mozarteum in Salzburg,

Austria, and the Cors de interpetation des pianists in Paris, France.

Certified as a master teacher by the American Music Society, Judith taught piano in Memphis for 32 years, having received the Tennessee Music Teacher of the Year Award in 1999. Her students won numerous piano competitions and have performed in Carnegie Hall and as soloists with the Kansas City, Paducah, Richardson, Texas; and Germantown Symphonies. Judith has made four piano recordings, including Legacy of Love in 1992 and Love Songs to Remember in 2011.

Judith retired and moved home to Dresden in 2020 and considers it her great joy to live here again and play the piano at her home church. In addition, Judith's retirement has given her time to devote to her second love, that of writing.

She pays loving tribute to her South African husband, Llewellyn Wade; her daughter, Lisa Fairchild Ramirez; and her sister, Janey Pritchett Williams, for their enduring support. She dedicates her love of music and writing to her two granddaughters, Marina Fairchild Law and Rebecca Rose Ramirez. Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go. --Joshua 1:9

Each year at this time, thousands of people stand in the cold in Times Square, New York. No big event beckons them. No ballgame is being played. No rock concert is getting underway. It's simply a huge, lighted ball that drops from a tall building. And within a few seconds, hardly worth fighting traffic and crowd pushing for, it descends marking a new year.

They had wandered for 40 years in the desert, and finally they could see land flowing with milk and honey ahead. Better yet, they had God's promise that He would never leave or forsake them.

As you stand with your back to the old year and look forward to the new one, you can have hope in the promises of God. You will certainly face both trying and joyful times ahead, but you can rest assured that He "will never leave you nor forsake you" (Joshua 1:5). That promise is enough to celebrate the new year ahead!
