From the Pastor's desk...

"You worship what you do not know; we know what we worship, for salvation is of the Jews. But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth." John 4:22-24

The story is told of a woman who was trapped in an apartment building. As she screamed for help, a brave fireman went up a ladder to rescue her. He took her in his arms and carried her down that ladder. He saved her life. A few days later, the woman went to the firehouse to thank the fireman. She was so grateful for his actions. In time, they fell in love and got married.

Similarly, when we are in need, we cry out for God to save us. It's a legitimate prayer of need. We call upon Him when we are in trouble, and He saves us. Then, we thank Him. This gratitude is true worship. Worship is the adoring, contemplation of God revealed in the Lord Jesus Christ. Worship is all that we are, responding to all that God is. All that we are - body, soul, spirit, mind, will, and emotions - thanking God for all that He is. It is everything in us responding to all that God is. Our English word worship comes from the word, "worth-ship." We place worth on what we worship. Indeed, we worship what we feel is valuable, meaningful, and amazing. Revelation 5:12 speaks of those around the throne saying with a loud voice, "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain, to receive power and riches and wisdom, and strength and honor and glory and blessing!" Would you like to take a barometer of your worship? It's a simple test. How much do you love God? How much does He mean to you? Just look at your worship. The way you worship God will tell others what you think of the Lord Jesus Christ. How much does He matter to you? Whatever Jesus is worth to you will show up in your worship.




