Reading the Bible in a year helps you grasp the overarching story of Scripture, understand God's character more fully, build spiritual discipline, and connect different parts of the Bible, revealing Jesus throughout the narrative, all while fostering a consistent faith habit with manageable daily readings (around 15 mins).

Key Benefits:

See the Big Picture: Connects individual stories, laws, prophecies, and letters into one cohesive narrative of God's redemption plan.

Deeper Understanding: Reveals Jesus in every book and helps you understand the Bible's different genres and themes.

Spiritual Growth: Promotes a closer relationship with God through consistent engagement, introspection, and prayer.

Builds Discipline: Creates a regular, achievable habit for spiritual development, fostering consistency.

Discover New Insights: Forces you to read unfamiliar books and passages, leading to fresh perspectives on God's character.


Here are some dates to remember:

Jan. 9-10: Youth Winter Retreat at Reelfoot Retreat Center.


