From the Pastor's desk...

"A son honors his father, and a servant his master. If then I am the Father, where is My honor? And if I am a Master, where is My reverence?" says the Lord of hosts to you priests who despise My name. Yet you say, "In what way have we despised Your name?" Malachi 1:6

Do we recognize the nature of God? As you read the verse today, you will discover that sons are to honor their fathers and servants are to honor their masters. It's the way it works best. Similarly, God says that He is both a father and a master. That's His nature. And He is to be honored as both a father and a master in our lives.

What does the word "honor" mean? In the Hebrew language, the word "honor" signifies something to which we attach weight, seriousness and significance, If you don't take God seriously, worship is going to be a bother and an inconvenience for you. But when you understand that God is your Father, that you've been born into a family by a new birth, and how much He loves you, things will change. You won't approach God with boring or lackluster worship. Instead, you're going to come before the Lord with love and devotion to honor our great God.

Our Lord had rather you not come to church at all than to come to church and not take God seriously. Revelation 3:15-16 says, "I know your works, that you are neither cold nor hot. I could wish you were cold or hot. So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth."

God had rather have you cold - out and out against Him -than to have you lukewarm, coming to church, insulting Him with half-hearted worship. G. Campbell Morgan said that half-hearted worship or lukewarmness is the worst form of blasphemy. It is worse than not even believing in God. Why? Because lukewarmness says to God that you believe in Him but aren't really interested in worshiping Him. To be lukewarm is to be bored by your relationship with Almighty God.
