Dear Church family,

As we enter this "Thanksgiving Season" let us be reminded of Paul's exhortation to the church of Thessalonica in I Thessalonians 5:18, "In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

We concede that we should give thanks in "some things", but "everything" and "all" things? Please note, Paul says give thanks "in" everything, and not "for" everything. It speaks more about our perspective toward life than it does about our attitude toward our circumstances.

Their journey does not go as planned, however, and the result leads to some interesting encounters with various people from the past.
